## IMPLEMENTATION PLAN: INVESTIGATION OF POLITICAL RELATED CASES KWAZULU NATAL FROM 2018-07-01 TO 2018-12-31

### 1. Purpose

The purpose of this information note is to request the approval of the strategy, its implementation plan and funding for investigation and prosecution of political related cases in KwaZulu Natal.

### 2. Background

The spate of attacks and killings of political leaders, activists and Local Government officials in KwaZulu Natal since January 2011 continued unabated, escalated towards the 2016 Local Government Elections and to date has reached unprecedented and appalling levels. During May 2018, the President of the Republic established the Inter Ministerial Committee (IMC) consisting of the ministries of State Security, Justice and Correctional Services and Police. The committee is chaired by the Minister of Police and is tasked with ensuring that the perpetrators of these crimes are brought to book.

The IMC met with the Task Team investigating these cases on 21 May 2018 and one of preliminary observations was that this multidisciplinary Task Team was working in silos and that it does not have an investigation and prosecutorial plan or strategy that is aligned to overall government priorities contained in the National Development Plan (NDP) 2030, the Medium Term Strategic Framework (MTSF) and other key policy prescripts i.e. creating safe and secure environment.

The Acting Provincial Commissioner of Police in KwaZulu Natal then led the process of developing the Strategy for Investigation and Prosecution of Political Related Cases in the Province which was tabled during the follow up



meeting of the IMC on the 12th of May 2018. The Strategy and its Implementation Plan were provisionally approved by the National Commissioner.

#### 3. Current Situation

When reflecting upon the criminal cases reported to the SAPS within the Province of KwaZulu-Natal for the period 2011-01-01 until 2018-05-30. Records reflect the total of 99 Political related cases was reported as per the following breakdown:

The status of these cases as per the break down below in terms of investigation and prosecution shows an unacceptable situation when comparing cases that are still under investigation, already withdrawn and those that have been finalized. This then necessitated an intervention in a project format.

### 3. The operational approach and concepts

The approach is based on the tried and tested method of integrating operational processes, resources, competencies, capabilities and intelligence from all operational environments of SAPS with dedicated and centralised command structures in order to achieve the clearly defined objective in a result driven and holistic manner, and is implemented as follows:

- Determining the operational area (Mission Area Joint Operational Centre), in this case KwaZulu Natal Province and divide it into four small and manageable action areas (Tactical Joint Operational Centres)in this case four geographic zones made up of between two and seven Clusters
- Establish and activate MAJOC and TACJOC's at identified locations and appoint suitable, experienced and competent Operational and Tactical Commanders as well as members to implement and command the following operational concepts:
  - Intelligence Gathering, Analysis and Co-ordination
  - Combat and Reaction Approach
  - Investigation and Prosecution including Organised Crime Approach
  - · Communication & Liaison
- Establish an integrated small operational teams that are inclusive of the following disciplines:
  - Crime Intelligence Gathers, and Analysts to implement Pillar: 1
     (Intelligence Gathering, Coordination and Analysis)
  - NIU and TRT to implement Pillar:2 (Combat and Reaction Approach)
  - DPCI, Detectives, Forensic Services and National Prosecuting Authority to implement Pillar:3 (Investigation and Prosecution including Organised Crime Approach)
  - IMC, Steering Committee, DPCI and SAPS Corporate Communication to implement Pillar:4 (Communication & Liaison)

## IMPLEMENTATION PLAN: INVESTIGATION OF POLITICAL RELATED CASES KWAZULU NATAL FROM 2018-07-01 TO 2018-12-31

### 1. Purpose

The purpose of this information note is to request the approval of the strategy, its implementation plan and funding for investigation and prosecution of political related cases in KwaZulu Natal.

## 2. Background

The spate of attacks and killings of political leaders, activists and Local Government officials in KwaZulu Natal since January 2011 continued unabated, escalated towards the 2016 Local Government Elections and to date has reached unprecedented and appalling levels. During May 2018, the President of the Republic established the Inter Ministerial Committee (IMC) consisting of the ministries of State Security, Justice and Correctional Services and Police. The committee is chaired by the Minister of Police and is tasked with ensuring that the perpetrators of these crimes are brought to book.

The IMC met with the Task Team investigating these cases on 21 May 2018 and one of preliminary observations was that this multidisciplinary Task Team was working in silos and that it does not have an investigation and prosecutorial plan or strategy that is aligned to overall government priorities contained in the National Development Plan (NDP) 2030, the Medium Term Strategic Framework (MTSF) and other key policy prescripts i.e. creating safe and secure environment.

The Acting Provincial Commissioner of Police in KwaZulu Natal then led the process of developing the Strategy for Investigation and Prosecution of Political Related Cases in the Province which was tabled during the follow up

meeting of the IMC on the 12<sup>th</sup> of May 2018. The Strategy and its Implementation Plan were provisionally approved by the National Commissioner.

### 3. Current Situation

When reflecting upon the criminal cases reported to the SAPS within the Province of KwaZulu-Natal for the period 2011-01-01 until 2018-05-30. Records reflect the total of 99 Political related cases was reported as per the following breakdown:

The status of these cases as per the break down below in terms of investigation and prosecution shows an unacceptable situation when comparing cases that are still under investigation, already withdrawn and those that have been finalized. This then necessitated an intervention in a project format.

## 3. The operational approach and concepts

The approach is based on the tried and tested method of integrating operational processes, resources, competencies, capabilities and intelligence from all operational environments of SAPS with dedicated and centralised command structures in order to achieve the clearly defined objective in a result driven and holistic manner, and is implemented as follows:

- Determining the operational area (Mission Area Joint Operational Centre), in this case KwaZulu Natal Province and divide it into four small and manageable action areas (Tactical Joint Operational Centres)in this case four geographic zones made up of between two and seven Clusters
- Establish and activate MAJOC and TACJOC's at identified locations and appoint suitable, experienced and competent Operational and Tactical Commanders as well as members to implement and command the following operational concepts:
  - Intelligence Gathering, Analysis and Co-ordination
  - Combat and Reaction Approach
  - Investigation and Prosecution including Organised Crime Approach
  - Communication & Liaison
- Establish an integrated small operational teams that are inclusive of the following disciplines:
  - Crime Intelligence Gathers, and Analysts to implement Pillar: 1 (Intelligence Gathering, Coordination and Analysis)
  - NIU and TRT to implement Pillar:2 (Combat and Reaction Approach)
  - DPCI, Detectives, Forensic Services and National Prosecuting Authority to implement Pillar:3 (Investigation and Prosecution including Organised Crime Approach)
  - IMC, Steering Committee, DPCI and SAPS Corporate Communication to implement Pillar:4 (Communication & Liaison)

PERFORMANCE REPORT AND REQUEST FOR PROJECT EXTENTION: INVESTIGATION AND PROSECUTION OF POLITICALLY RELATED CASES IN KWAZULU-NATAL FROM JULY 2018 TO JUNE 2021

### 1. PURPOSE

The purpose of this information note is to provide a detailed performance report by the Task Team Investigating Political Killings in KwaZulu-Natal Province as directed by the National Commissioner on 31<sup>st</sup> May 2021 and provide for the estimated costing on the extension of the project for the period for 01<sup>st</sup> July 2021 until 31<sup>st</sup> March 2022.

#### 2. BACKGROUND

The escalation of politically related incidents in KwaZulu-Natal up to 2018 led to the President of the Republic of South Africa establishing the Inter Ministerial Committee (IMC) consisting of the Ministries of State Security Agency, Defence, Police, Justice and Correctional Services. The committee is chaired by the Minister of Police and is tasked with ensuring that the perpetrators of political related cases in KwaZulu-Natal are brought to book.

The Multi-Disciplinary Task Team consisting of the South African Police Service (SAPS), National Prosecuting Authority (NPA), State Security Agency (SSA) and Department of Justice and Correctional Services (DJ&CS) was then established by the IMC to develop and implement the approved strategy for investigation and prosecution of politically related cases in the province effective from **July 2018**. The current phase of Task Team was approved up until 2021-06-30.

### 3. ALLOCATED CASE DOCKETS

As of June 2021 the Team is allocated and accounts for 231 political related cases in line with the approved criteria. In addition, a total of 88 case dockets not related to the Task Team mandate but linked with same suspects on political related cases were taken by the Task Team for parallel investigation. Over and above the allocated political related and parallel cases, the Task Team is conducting intelligence-driven operations and Fireams Controls Act compliance inspections targeting unlicensed firearms which have since led to 147 cases being registered and being investigated by the Task Team.

PERFORMANCE REPORT AND REQUEST FOR PROJECT EXTENTION: INVESTIGATION AND PROSECUTION OF POLITICALLY RELATED CASES IN KWAZULU-NATAL FROM JULY 2018 TO JUNE 2021

This report will highlight the breakdown and status of investigation and prosecution of a total of 466 cases dockets currently allocated to the Task Team.

#### 4. PERSONNEL AND EXPENDITURE

### 4.1 **July 2018 to June 2019**

When the Task Team was established, a total of 132 members were called up at a costing of R49 138 808.00 for the period 1<sup>st</sup> July 2018 to 31<sup>st</sup> December 2018. The next extension from 31<sup>st</sup> December 2018 to 31<sup>st</sup> March 2019 which was meant to be a handing over phase and as part of pre Elections 2019 stabilisation plan was approved on the same costing.

The decision was then taken that the sustainability and demobilisation plan of the Task Team be gradually implemented so that all cases are continuously investigated and prosecuted hence the extension from 1<sup>st</sup> April to 30<sup>th</sup> June 2019 was granted at a costing of R19 466 475.00.

## 4.2 **July 2019 to September 2019**

Due to the matters of concern that were raised during the Inter-Ministerial Committee briefing, the National Commissioner and National Director of Public Prosecution had to intervene by implementing the integrated strategy to investigate and prosecute perpetrators of Political related cases for the duration of three months 30<sup>th</sup> June 2019 to 30<sup>th</sup> September 2019 at a decreased 112 number of members which was costed at R 19 995 648.00.

The budget from the beginning of the project 05<sup>th</sup> July 2018 up to September 2019 was allocated and managed by KwaZulu Natal Provincial Commissioner, actual expenditure R88 219 536.00.

From October 2019 to date, the budget was allocated to and managed by the Divisional Commissioner, Division: Operational Response Services.

#### 4.3 October 2019 to March 2020

An extension was further granted to the Task Team to continue with the implementation of the integrated strategy to investigate and prosecute perpetrators of Political related cases for the duration of six months 1<sup>st</sup> October 2019 to 31<sup>st</sup> March 2020 at an increased 152 number of members which was costed at R 40 545 014.00 with actual expenditure of R 34 628 904.00 resulting in less expenditure balance of R 5 916 110.00.

## 4.4 1st April 2020 to 31st March 2021

In order to address the backlog on trial ready cases and to finalise the investigation on the then 39 cases by the enhanced Multi-Disciplinary Task Team involving SAPS and NPA. Further extension was the granted for a period 1<sup>st</sup> April 2020 to 31<sup>st</sup> March 2021 at a decreased of 105 members and was costed at R63 889 800.00with actual expenditure of R63 889 800.00.

## 4.5 1st April 2021 to 30 June 2021

An application for the extension of the Task Team for the period 1<sup>st</sup> April 2021 to 31<sup>st</sup> March 2022 was submitted, however the approval was only for the period of three months (1<sup>st</sup> April 2021 to 30 June 2021 at an increase of 110 members and was approved at cost of R24 378 000.00 with actual expenditure of R 21 923 923.00 resulting in less expenditure balance of R 2 454 077.00

Therefore, from the July 2018 to date, the total estimated expenditure based on the approvals is R 234 535 341.00, with the actual expenditure of R 209 023 448.00 resulting in less expenditure balance of R 25 511 893.00

The National Commissioner has approved the extension in principle for the period 1<sup>st</sup> July 2021 to 31 March 2022 with a costing of R 73 629 156. 00

## 7.2 REQUEST FOR ADDITIONAL VEHICLES AND MOTIVATION

Due to the capacitation of the task team personnel in line with the volume of court going dockets and dockets that are still under investigation, an additional (08) investigating officers with (08) combat members, (8) more combat members to provide in transit protection of 10 Advocates allocated to the team and (2) more Ballistic experts will be called up. This will then necessitate additional ten vehicles.

- 3 x Toyota Hilux or similar Double Cab to conduct investigation including tracing and locating of suspects and also the bad terrain experienced at some areas.
- 3 x Toyota Quantum or similar (Bus) Each per TACJOC for effective take down operations which can convey more members (16) at once to identified hotspots and operational areas without convoys, also to blend with communities at taxi ranks and hotels.
- 4 x Toyota Hilux or similar Close Double Cab to convey suspects and accused persons to and from police cells, rehabilitation centres (prisons) and different courts within the Province of KwaZulu-Natal.

For security reasons and effectiveness of the operations, it is recommended that the requested vehicles as replacements or new allocation be of different makes and colours which can be sourced from a pool of SAPS Mechanical Transport, Standard Operating Procedure: Regulation 80(6) vehicles or those that have been returned by Senior Managers at the Division: Supply Chain Management, provided that they are still in a good mechanical condition.

The recommended make of vehicles is due to the fact that these vehicles are expected to travel the whole province and beyond almost on daily basis and therefore, durability is of importance.

## 8. PERFOMANCE REPORT

From the inception of the Task Team in July 2018 to date, a total of 251 suspects have been arrested and charged on 161 cases.

The 06 cases were withdrawn due to insufficient evidence.

Out of the 113 finalized cases 34 are finalized as guilty with 45 accused convicted. 16 finalized as not guilty, 20 declined to prosecute, 10 finalized as undetected, 07 referred for inquest investigation (J56 issued), 04 finalized as unfounded and 22 were finalized as per 2020 judgement by the Constitutional Court on the Intimidation Act1 (1) (b) which classifies some actions of intimidation as not constituting a crime.

### 8.6 Compliance Inspections conducted

The team has also conducted compliance inspections on identified institutions and individuals to recover the used firearms and thus far a total of 1178 firearms were confiscated for ballistic testing, 40 cases registered and 30 suspects arrested.

- 6 x Municipalities (4 cases registered)
- 1 x Police station (1 case registered)
- 4 x Individuals (4 cases registered)

## 8.7 Project driven investigations on identified trends (firearms, ammunition and intimidations)

To enhance the efforts of finding the murder weapons and also understanding of ever increasing intimidation incidents involving politicians, the Team conducted analysis on all cases and some of the findings were as follows:

Firearms and ammunitions are easily accessible to criminals.



• Murder cases that are political related are decreasing and intimidation cases are increasing as criminals are taking advantage of the vulnerability of politicians by intimidating and extorting them for monetary gain.

The analysis further revealed that these cases are interlinked and require a project driven investigation approach, which led the team identifying projects to deal with these trends.

Project 1: aimed at addressing the proliferation of firearms by security companies not adhering to regulation as Governed by Firearm Controls Act with the intention to supply firearms to hitmen from the taxi violence industry who are also hired for political killings and unlawful sale of deceased firearms by fraudulent means through the office of compromised DFO's.

The investigation has currently identified three avenues in order to address the proliferation of firearms in the province to ensure stabilisation as follows:

- Security companies whose mandate is to guard the taxi ranks; however, they are being used by political figures to eliminate their opposition in order to secure political positions. 31 cases have been registered
- ❖ Taxi violence industry hitmen are also being used for political killings. 62 cases of taxi violence have been identified for analysis.
- Deceased persons are targeted by bogus gun shop who obtain firearms from deceased estates and become easily accessible to hitmen. A total number of 32 cases have since been registered. This part of the project will be implemented throughout the Country driven by Provincial Heads: Operational Command Centre(s) and Visible Policing guided by the Task Team as directed by the National Steering Committee.

Project 2: aimed at identifying and eradicating the illegal supply of ammunition by Gun shops, licensed firearm holders and institutions.

Investigation has positively linked an employee working at legally operating gun shop who is supplying hitmen with ammunition throughout KwaZulu-Natal by

linking the head stamps of the ammunition. This employee has already been charged on one of the political related case and linked with two more cases.

More employees and gunshops are still to be identified. The project has since been escalated to Directorate for Priority Crime Investigation as per the National Commissioner's directives.

Project 3: aimed at identifying syndicates who are taking advantage of political instability within KZN by intimidating and extorting (Mayors and Councillors).

The project is at the advance stage as the suspects have been identified and linked with the cell phone numbers and Hollywood bets account. The handsets used by suspects are still to be located. A total number of **55** cases have been registered. The project will be finalized by the Task Team.

#### 9. MATTERS OF CONCERN

## CONCERN 1: Questionable Prosecution Decisions & Sentences regarding the Firearm related cases

The Team is encountering a problem regarding the decision taken and sentences imposed on accused of intimidation and cases involving firearms as these in most cases are being prosecuted by lower courts and there is no consistency decision to prosecute and on the sentences.

## **CONCERN 2:** Involvement of police officials and political figures reporting false cases

Continues to emerge during investigation of political related cases which delays the investigation of main cases.

## CONCERN 3: The lack of dedicated Courts and Magistrates which result in delayed decisions, prosecution and trial

The Sawoti Regional Court has been identified by the KZN Provincial Judge President however the proposed rotational duty roster for staff, will be impossible because of shortage of staff due to the current Covid-19 crisis.

## 10. BEST PRACTICES

## 10.1 Integrated Multi-Disciplinary Approach

- The approach is based on the method of integrating all relevant disciplines (Operational Analysts, Information collectors, Investigating Officers, Forensic Analysts, Ballistic Analysts, Communication Analysts, Digital Forensic Analysts, Designated Firearm Officer, Combat and Operational Support) from SAPS into a Centralised Command Structure.
- Establish dedicated capacity from other stakeholders i.e. NPA (Prosecutors and Witness Protection Programme Officers), Correctional Services and State Security Agency (SSA).
- Analysis of the docket and compilation of each docket action plan by the operational analysts and investigating officers.
- Allocate the case dockets to teams made up of two investigating officers and two combat members not individual investigating officers.
- Tactical commanders to meet on a daily basis to inspect dockets and direct operations in accordance to tasking's aimed at collecting evidence to link identified suspects with the case are discussed and issued to various teams and feedback is monitored on a daily basis for accountability.
- Ensure that all the investigative tools such as statement/timeline analysis reports, forensic reports, ballistic reports, communication analysis reports, cellphone and video extracts are optimally utilized.
- Prepare presentation on the collected evidence to brief the prosecution team.
- Conduct regular Prosecutor Guided Investigations on a regular basis until the finalization of the case.



- Proper Implementation of Pillar 4 which is investigation that includes Organised Crime Approach
- At the initial stage, investigate the motive to identify the possible suspects
- Create an organogram placing the identified possible suspects on their respective roles and obtain their detailed profiles.
- Collection of evidence to link each identified suspect

## 10.2 Threat Analysis

- Identify the geographical hotspots
- Prioritize the geographical areas
- Target the problematic areas
- Identify and profile the known and feared hitmen in the area

## 10.3 Man-Marking Strategy

- Identify the involvement of suspects through information gathering
- Conduct profiles to identify previous cases that were withdrawn to resuscitate the cases.
- Analyse all cases against the targets to identify similarities on cartridge cases, modus operandi, vehicles, etc.
- ❖ Collect evidence to link the target to as many cases as possible
- Arrest and charge the target

### 10.4 Opposition of Bail

- Conduct bail investigation including criminal records of the suspects
- Ensure court attendance by investigating officer
- Prepare oral evidence in terms of aggravating factors that will ensure bail is denied
- Preparation of bail opposition in conjunction with the allocated prosecutor

### 10.5 Enforcement of Firearms Control Act, Act No. 60 of 2000

- Profile targets to determine ownership of firearms
- Conduct compliance inspection on the identified targets
- Submit firearms for ballistic testing





### 11. RECOMMENDATIONS

The National Steering Committee comprising of the South African Police Service, Directorate for Priority Crime Investigation (DPCI) National Prosecuting Authority (NPA) and the State Security Agency (SSA) hereby submits that:

- ❖ The Task Team should implement the stabilisation plan for the period of first six months and then the normalisation plan should take effect which will incorporate the establishment of Murder and Robbery Unit in KwaZulu-Natal.
- In order to address the backlog on trial ready cases and finalise the investigation on 64 cases, the enhanced Multi-Disciplinary Task Team involving SAPS and NPA be extended from 1st July 2021 to 31st March 2022.
- As this is a project based intervention, it is imperative to ensure that the objectives are achieved within the set timeframes with a long term effect on stability and effectiveness of Criminal Justice System.
- There is a potential risk that the 199 court going cases and 64 cases under investigation may collapse if the current Task Team withdraws without them being finalized.
- Additional capacity for Detectives possibly those earmarked for Murder and Robbery Units be added to deal with cases currently going to court in order to allow investigation to continue on other cases that are still under investigation.
- ❖ Dedicated prosecution capacity is required to address the firearm related cases in order to deter the norm of viewing firearm related cases as minor offences which results to accused persons being given suspended sentences.
- The issue of a dedicated courtroom identified at Sawoti and magistrates be finalized with the Department of Justice in order to address the trial ready cases which will increase the efficiency and effectiveness of the Task Team.
- Due to the number of cases reported on the project driven investigation, an additional capacity of both dedicated investigators and prosecutors is required to focus on project driven investigation and prosecution including the involvement of Organized Crime Unit.

- Other physical resources as indicated in paragraphs 5 and 6 be provided for effective functioning of the Task Team.
- ❖ In terms of the National Intelligence Estimate (NIE) and the submission by the State Security Agency (SSA) at the National Steering Committee meeting, the incidents of political related cases are expected to increase between now and the next Local Government Elections in August 2021 as it was the case during the 2016 Local Government Elections.
- ❖ The National Commissioner: South African Police Service, General KJ Sitole, take note of the contents of this performance reports and consider the approval for extension for the duration of nine months (July 2021 to March 2022) with an estimated budget of R 73 629 156.00. The estimated operational budget is broken down as follows: -

The estimated budget for the above recommended vehicle is **R 15 000 000.00** 

The expenditure on overtime allowance is currently not avoidable because the 199 number of court going dockets require the total current capacity of 21 investigating officers to be at different courts from Monday to Friday and the only time available to proceed with investigation of 64 cases is after hours and during weekends. Unless if the current capacity of investigating officers is multiplied by two (2) to allow for both court and investigating duties to be performed during office hours and increase the goods and services budget.



#### CONCLUSION 12.

The best practices that are applied by the Task Team will serve as a benchmark for the reestablishment of the Murder and Robbery Units to cater for the current trends and patterns that are totally different from the previous methods which are no longer relevant.

This approach serves as a deterrent to alleviate any form of corruption within specialised units, SAPS at large including the whole Justice System, and it can help to develop pioneers of modern and professional policing as required by the National Development Plan 2030 of the South African Government.

REQUEST FOR EXTENTION: MULTI-DISCIPLINARY TASK TEAM ON INVESTIGATION AND PROSECUTION OF POLITICAL RELATED CASES IN KWAZULU NATAL: 30 JUNE 2019 TO 30 SEPTEMBER 2019

#### 1. PURPOSE

The purpose of this information note is to seek the approval for the business plan for the extension and the estimated budget thereof of Integrated Multi-Disciplinary Task Team on Investigation and Prosecution of Political related cases in KwaZulu Natal from 30 June 2019 to 30 September 2019.

#### 2. BACKGROUND

The Inter-Ministerial Committee as established by the President of the Republic was tasked with ensuring that the perpetrators of political related cases in KwaZulu Natal are brought to book.

The acting Provincial Commissioner of Police in KwaZulu Natal was then tasked to develop the Strategy and the Implementation Business Plan for Investigation and Prosecution of Political Related cases in the Province which was approved by the National Commissioner. The Multidisciplinary Task Team consisting of 132 members from different operational environments of SAPS was established as from 05 July 2018 to 31 December 2018, and was extended until 30 June 2019 with actual budget of R101 000 000 excluding the purchasing of 30 vehicles.

The Task Team has done very well in terms of stabilizing the situation as most of the case dockets allocated are now going to court as a result of suspects being identified and arrested.

## 3. PROGRESS REPORT (JULY 2018 TO JUNE 2019)

Currently the team is allocated and accounts for 170 dockets of politically related cases in line with the approved criteria which includes 38 new cases reported after the formation of the task team.



In addition, a total of **79** case dockets not related to the Task Team mandate but linked with allocated political related cases are taken by the Task Team for parallel investigation.

Over and above the allocated and parallel politically related cases, the Task Team is conducting intelligence-driven operations targeting unlicensed firearms which have led to 37 arrested suspects on 31 cases and 30 firearms were recovered. These two categories of cases are also allocated to the Task Team to ensure centralised investigation and prosecution.

The Task Team has successfully decreased the cases under investigation as out of 170 case dockets allocated only 54 cases are still under investigation, 62 cases are court going, 1 case withdrawn and 53 cases are finalised. The detailed success report of the Task Team is attached for easy reference.

Due to 54 cases that are still under investigation and 62 cases that are court going it is therefore requested that the project be extended from 30 June to 30 September 2019.

## 4. OPERATIONAL APPROACH AND CONCEPT (JULY TO SEPTEMBER 2019)

The approach is based on the tried and tested method of integrating operational processes, resources, competencies, capabilities and intelligence from all operational environments of SAPS with dedicated and centralized command structures in order to achieve the clearly defined objective in a result driven and holistic manner, and is implemented as follows:

- Determining the operational area (Mission Area Joint Operational Centre), in this case KwaZulu Natal Province and divide it into two manageable action areas (Tactical Joint Operational Centre's) of KwaZulu Natal Province which are, North Coast and Central into CENTRANO, Midlands and South Coast into MIDSOU
- Establish and activate MAJOC as Command Structure (19 with additional 29 roving team members) and two TACJOC's (29 and 35 members per TACJOC respectively) at identified locations and appoint suitable, experienced and competent Operational and Tactical Commanders as well as members to implement and command the following operational concepts:
  - Pillar 1: Intelligence Gathering, Analysis and Co-ordination
  - o Pillar 2: Investigation and Prosecution
  - o Pillar 3: Combat and Reaction





- Establish integrated small operational teams at two TACJOCs and one Roving Team that are inclusive of the following disciplines:
  - o Crime Intelligence Collectors, NIU Information Collectors and Tracking Team members to implement Pillar 1
  - Directorate of Priority Crimes Investigation, Detectives, Forensic Services and National Prosecuting Authority to implement Pillar 2
  - National Intervention Unit and Tactical Response Team to implement Pillar 3

## 5. COMPOSITION OF TASK TEAM

Due to the increase of allocated political related case dockets from 132 to 170 and additional dockets drawn from various Police Stations (79 Parallel cases) and registered by the Task Team (31 ADHOC cases), including the increase of court going dockets, a need has been identified to increase the current capacity of Detectives from 26 to 32.

PROGRESS REPORT ON INVESTIGATION OF POLITICAL RELATED CASES: KWAZULU-NATAL: 12 NOVEMBER 2019.

#### 1. PURPOSE

The purpose of this Information note is to provide a detailed progress report by the Task Team on the investigation of politically related cases in KwaZulu-Natal Province and to recommend the extension of the project for another four months on a lower scale of **105** members from **152** currently deployed.

#### 2. BACKGROUND

Since the inception of the Task Team on 2018-07-05, a total of **182** case dockets have been allocated which is inclusive of **51** cases that were reported after the establishment of the Task Team i.e. **87** murders, **30** attempted murder, **42** Intimidations and **23** other charges.

When the Task Team was established it inherited, a total of 132 case dockets of which 79 were under investigation, 25 pending at court, 14 were withdrawn and 14 finalised.

The current phase was applied for six months as per attached, however approval was granted by the National Commissioner for two months (October and November 2019) with a recommendation that the Task Team submit a comprehensive progress report for any further extension.

#### 3. PROGRESS REPORT

#### 3.1 Status of allocated case dockets

The current status of 182 case dockets is as indicated below:

Ou1t of **59** cases under investigation, **6** were referred for inquest investigation, **15** are at the advanced stage and suspects are expected to be arrested soon. The **3** cases were withdrawn due to witnesses contracting themselves and refusing to testify.

Out of the **49** cases pending at court, **8** are remanded for further investigation, 1 on bail application stage and **40** at trial stage. The trial dates for **31** cases are set during November and December 2019 and **18** are set for January to March 2020.

Out of the **71** finalised cases, **28** are finalised as guilty, **7** finalised as not guilty, **12** were declined to prosecute, **6** closed as undetected and **18** are unfounded of which **9** as per the recent judgement by the Constitutional Court on the Intimidation Act 1(1) (b) and **9** as the result of absence of elements of crime (possible false cases).

## 3.2 Status of arrested suspects

From the inception of the Task Team in July 2018 to date, a total of **225** suspects have been arrested and charged on **88** cases.

Out of 225 suspects arrested

- > 50 In custody
- > 50 On bail
- > 11 Turned state witnesses
- > 07 Deceased
- > 15 Not guilty
- > 31 Convicted
- > 61 released by court

It should be noted that the challenge of suspects being released on bail and by court has diminished since the intervention by the National Commissioner and the National Director of Public Prosecution regarding the dedicated prosecution team. Some of the suspects that were released prior to this intervention, charges have since been reinstated against them.

### 3.3 Parallel Case dockets

In addition, a total of **95** case dockets not related to the Task Team mandate but linked with same suspects on political related cases were taken by the Task Team for parallel investigation.

- > 19 are under investigation
- > 65 are pending at court
- > 4 withdrawn
- > 5 not guilty
- ➤ 2 guilty



#### 3.4 ADHOC Case dockets

Over and above the allocated political related and parallel cases, the Task Team is conducting intelligence-driven operations targeting unlicensed firearms which has since led to 37 cases being registered, 43 suspects arrested and 47 firearms recovered of which 7 have been positively linked with political related cases.

- > 5 are under investigation
- > 18 court going
- > 3 withdrawn
- 3 not enrolled
- > 8 conviction

### 4. COMPLIANCE INSPECTION ON SECURITY COMPANIES AND MUNICIPALITY

Compliance inspections were conducted on **16** identified security companies and **5** municipalities which resulted in **1055** firearms being confiscated and sent for ballistic testing.

A total of 43 cases were registered, 18 under investigation, 1 withdrawn, 18 pending at court and 6 finalised.

## 5. INVOLVEMENT OF POLICE OFFICERS IN POLITICAL RELATED CASES

A very disturbing situation which might be a reason why these cases were not successfully investigated prior to the establishment of the Task Team is the involvement of police officials during the commission of these crimes or after the commission of the crime by defeating the ends of justice. This has been evident as a total of **16** police officers have been arrested and charged by the Task Team on cases ranging from murder to defeating the ends of justice.

### 6. FALSE CASES REPORTED BY POLITITIANS

A total of 5 false cases ranging from attempted murder to intimidation have been reported with the intention of acquiring bodyguards or shifting the focus of investigation as some are possible suspects. From the 5 cases reported, 4 cases have been successfully investigated and counter charges of defeating the ends of justice have been opened against complainants who has been subsequently charged, the other case is still under investigation.

## 7. HIGH PROFILE CASES

A total of **6** cases involving high profile individuals has been identified and are at the advanced stage of investigation. The difficulty experienced by the Team on bringing these individuals to book (cases enrolled and thereafter withdrawn against high profile individuals) seems to be diminishing as a result of the intervention by the National Commissioner and National Director of Public Prosecution who provided the dedicated Team of prosecutors to work with the Task Team.

Prospect are very high for imminent reinstating of the charges that were suspiciously withdrawn based on questionable decisions.

## 8. EXTENTION FOR THE NEXT FOUR MONTHS

It is envisaged that in order to address the backlog on trial ready cases and finalize the investigation on **59** cases, the enhanced Multi-Disciplinary Task Team involving SAPS and NPA be extended for a period of four months.

As this is a project based intervention, it is imperative to ensure that the objectives are achieved within the set timeframe with a long term effect on stability and effectiveness of Criminal Justice System.

There is a potential risk that the court going especially the **40** trial ready and **59** cases under investigation may collapse if the current Task Team withdraws without being finalized.

REQUEST FOR EXTENTION: MULTI-DISCIPLINARY TASK TEAM ON INVESTIGATION AND PROSECUTION OF POLITICAL RELATED CASES IN KWAZULU NATAL: 01 JULY 2019 TO 31 DECEMBER 2019

## 1. PURPOSE

The purpose of this information note is to seek the approval for the business plan for the extension and the estimated budget thereof of Integrated Multi-Disciplinary Task Team on Investigation and Prosecution of Political related cases in KwaZulu Natal from 01 July 2019 to 31 December 2019.

## 2. BACKGROUND

The Inter-Ministerial Committee as established by the President of the Republic was tasked with ensuring that the perpetrators of political related cases in KwaZulu Natal are brought to book.

The acting Provincial Commissioner of Police in KwaZulu Natal was then tasked to develop the Strategy and the Implementation Business Plan for Investigation and Prosecution of Political Related cases in the Province which was approved by the National Commissioner. The Multidisciplinary Task Team consisting of 132 members from different operational environments of SAPS was established as from 05 July 2018 to 31 December 2018, and was extended until 30 June 2019 with actual budget of R101 000 000 excluding the purchasing of 30 vehicles.

The Task Team has done very well in terms of stabilizing the situation as most of the case dockets allocated are now going to court as a result of suspects being identified and arrested.

## 3. PROGRESS REPORT (JULY 2018 TO JUNE 2019)

Currently the team is allocated and accounts for **167** dockets of politically related cases in line with the approved criteria which includes **35** new cases reported after the formation of the task team.

In addition, a total of **79** case dockets not related to the Task Team mandate but linked with allocated political related cases are taken by the Task Team for parallel investigation.

Over and above the allocated and parallel politically related cases, the Task Team is conducting intelligence-driven operations targeting unlicensed firearms which have led to 37 arrested suspects on 31 cases and 30 firearms were recovered. These two categories of cases are also allocated to the Task Team to ensure centralised investigation and prosecution.

The Task Team has successfully decreased the cases under investigation as out of 167 case dockets allocated only 51 cases are still under investigation, 62 cases are court going, 1 case withdrawn and 53 cases are finalised. The detailed success report of the Task Team is attached for easy reference.

Due to 51 cases that are still under investigation and 62 cases that are court going it is therefore requested that the project be extended from July to December 2019.

## 4. OPERATIONAL APPROACH AND CONCEPT (JULY TO DECEMBER 2019)

The approach is based on the tried and tested method of integrating operational processes, resources, competencies, capabilities and intelligence from all operational environments of SAPS with dedicated and centralized command structures in order to achieve the clearly defined objective in a result driven and holistic manner, and is implemented as follows:

- Determining the operational area (Mission Area Joint Operational Centre), in this case KwaZulu Natal Province and divide it into four small and manageable action areas (Tactical Joint Operational Centres) in this four geographic zones of KwaZulu Natal Province which are, North Coast, Central, Midlands and South Coast Regions.
- Establish and activate MAJOC as Command Structure (15 members) and four TACJOC's (35 members per TACJOC) at identified locations and appoint suitable, experienced and competent Operational and Tactical Commanders as well as members to implement and command the following operational concepts:
  - o Pillar 1: Intelligence Gathering, Analysis and Co-ordination
  - o Pillar 2: Investigation and Prosecution
  - o Pillar 3: Combat and Reaction
- Establish integrated small operational teams at all four TACJOCs that are inclusive of the following disciplines:
  - o Crime Intelligence Collectors, NIU Information Collectors and Tracking Team members to implement Pilla: 1

K

- Directorate of Priority Crimes Investigation, Detectives, Forensic Services and National Prosecuting Authority to implement Pillar 2
- o National Intervention Unit and Tactical Response Team to implement Pillar 3

## 5. COMPOSITION OF TASK TEAM

Due to the increase of allocated political related case dockets from 132 to 167 and additional dockets drawn from various Police Stations (78 Parallel cases) and registered by the Task Team (31 ADHOC cases), including the increase of court going dockets, a need has been identified to increase the current capacity of Detectives from 26 to 32.

Also the approval by the Department of Justice and Correctional Services to allocate dedicated centralized Court Room and Prosecutors to the Task Team has resulted in additional 13 members required to provide Court Orderly and escort duties.

These additional requirements will result in the increase of the total members of the Task Team from 132 to 155 including 4 Prosecutors. The breakdown of the Task Team will be as follows:

#### PURPOSE 1.

The purpose of this information note is to seek the approval of the integrated strategic plan and the estimated budget thereof of Integrated Multi-Disciplinary Task Team on Investigation and Prosecution of Political related cases in KwaZulu Natal from 30 September 2019 to 31 March 2020.

#### 2. **BACKGROUND**

Since inception on 2018-07-05, the Task Team has done very well in terms of stabilizing the situation as most of the case dockets allocated are now going to court as a result of suspects being identified and arrested.

The implementation of the integrated Multi-Disciplinary plan had some challenges that led to the Task Team briefing the National Director of Public Prosecutions and the National Commissioner of Police on Friday 2019-08-23.

Some of the challenges include:

- The lack of dedicated prosecutors which has contributed to the backlog of court going cases (62), increase of withdrawal of cases/charges and witnesses losing interest.
- The delayed decisions whether to prosecute or not by the DPP also negatively affects the turnaround time and finalization of investigation of these cases
- There are some questionable decisions to withdraw the cases or charges against some individuals without valid reasons, endorsement and queries in the docket.
- The delaying of trial of an accused who is pleading guilty which leads to accused persons to be influenced otherwise and change their plea of guilty.

PROGRESS REPORT AND REQUEST FOR PROJECT EXTENTION: INVESTIGATION AND PROSECUTION OF POLITICALLY RELATED CASES IN KWAZULU-NATAL: 23 MARCH 2021

#### 1. PURPOSE

The purpose of this information note is to provide a detailed progress report on Task Team Investigating Political Killings: KwaZulu-Natal Province as coordinated by the Division: Operational Response Services and recommend the extension of the project for the period for 01st April 2021 until 31st March 2022.

### 2. BACKGROUND

The escalation of politically related incidents in KwaZulu-Natal up to 2018 led to the President of the Republic of South Africa establishing the Inter Ministerial Committee (IMC) consisting of the Ministries of State Security Agency. Defence, Police, Justice and Correctional Services. The committee is chaired by the Minister of Police and is tasked with ensuring that the perpetrators of political related cases in KwaZulu Natal are brought to book.

The Multi-Disciplinary Task Team consisting of the South African Police Service (SAPS), National Prosecuting Authority (NPA), State Security Agency (SSA) and Department of Justice and Correctional Services (DJ&CS) was then established by the IMC to develop and implement the approved strategy for investigation and prosecution of politically related cases in the province effective from **July 2018**. The current phase of Task Team was approved up until 2021-03-31.

#### 3. PROGRESS REPORT

#### 3.1 Status of allocated case dockets

As of March 2021 the Team is allocated and accounts for 225 political related cases in line with the approved criteria. In addition, a total of 44 case dockets not related to the Task Team mandate but linked with same suspects on political related cases were taken by the Task Team for parallel investigation. Over and above the allocated political related and parallel cases, the Task Team is conducting intelligence-driven operations and Firearms Controls Act

compliance inspections targeting unlicensed firearms which have since led to 124 cases being registered and being investigated by the Task Team.

This report will highlight the breakdown and status of investigation and prosecution of a total of 393 cases dockets currently allocated to the Task Team.

### 3.1.1 Status of political related case dockets



Out of **62** cases under investigation, **19** are at advance stage of investigation and suspects are expected to be arrested soon.

On the **50** cases pending at court **4** are remanded for further investigation, **4** on bail application stage and **42** at trial stage. The 42 trial ready cases, the dates are set between the months of March 2021 and November 2021.

The **06** cases were withdrawn due to insufficient evidence.

Out of the 107 finalized cases 31 are finalized as guilty with 42 accused convicted, 16 finalized as not guilty, 18 declined to prosecute, 10 finalized as undetected, 07 referred for inquest investigation (J56 issued), 04 finalized as unfounded and 21 were finalized as per recent judgement by the Constitutional Court on the Intimidation Act1 (1) (b) which classifies some actions of intimidation as not constituting a crime.

### Status of arrested suspects on political related cases

From the inception of the Task Team in July 2018 to date, a total of **246** suspects have been arrested and charged on **117** cases.



- > 06 x Municipalities (388 firearms)
- > 02 x Individuals (03 firearms)
- > 02 x Police station (63 firearms)

# .2 Project driven investigations on identified trends (firearms, ammunition and intimidations)

The Team has analysed all allocated political related cases and established that some of these cases are interlinked and require a project driven investigation approach, which has led to the initiation of the following projects in order to deal with the root causes of political related cases.

The projects are aimed at enhancing the efforts of finding the murder weapons and also understanding of ever increasing intimidation incidents involving politicians.

### **Project 1**

Aimed at addressing the proliferation of firearms by **security companies** not adhering to regulation as Governed by Firearm Controls Act with the intention to supply firearms to hitmen from the **taxi violence industry** who are also hired for political killings and unlawful sale of **deceased firearms** by fraudulent means through the office of compromised DFO's.

Investigation has currently identified three avenues in order to address the proliferation of firearms in the province as follows:

- Security companies whose mandate is to guard the taxi ranks; however, they are being used by political figures to eliminate their opposition in order to secure political positions. 13 cases have been registered.
- > Taxi violence industry hitmen are also being used for political killings. 62 cases of taxi violence have been identified for analysis.
- Deceased persons are targeted by bogus gun shop owners who fraudulently obtain firearms from deceased estates and make them easily accessible to hitmen. A total number of 32 cases have since been registered against 20 identified suspects.

### 3.3 Project 2

Aimed at identifying and eradicating the illegal supply of ammunition by Gun shops, licensed firearm holders and institutions.

The investigation has positively linked an employee working at legally operating gun shop who is supplying hitmen with ammunition throughout Kwa-Zulu Natal by linking the head stamps of the ammunition. This employee has already been charged on one of the political related case. More employees and gun shops are still to be identified.

### 3.4 Project 3

Aimed at identifying syndicates who are taking advantage of political instability within KZN by intimidating and extorting (Mayors and Councillors).

This project is at the advanced stage as the suspects have been identified and linked with the cell phone numbers and Hollywood bets account. The handsets used by suspects are still to be located. A total number of 56 cases have been registered.

### 3.5 Matters of concern

### **CONCERN 1: Witness Protection Programme**

> The Team has reached a resolution with the NPA to hold monthly meetings in order to speedily address any problems or concerns raised by the witnesses at the programme as such no new challenges has emerged.

### **CONCERN 2: Questionable Sentences regarding the Firearm related cases**

> The Team is encountering a problem regarding the sentences imposed on accused of cases involving firearms as these in most cases are being prosecuted by lower courts and there is no consistency on the sentences.

### CONCERN 3: Involvement of police officials and political figures reporting false cases

> Continues to emerge during investigation of political related cases which delays the investigation of main cases.

# CONCERN 4: The lack of dedicated Courts and Magistrates which result in delayed decisions, prosecution and trial

> The Sawoti Regional Court has been identified by the KZN Provincial Judge President however the proposed rotational duty roster for staff, will be impossible because of shortage of staff due to the current Covid-19 crisis.

# 3.6 Reason for extension of the task team for the next financial year 2021-04-01 to 2022-03-31

The National Steering Committee comprising of the South African Police Service, Directorate for Priority Crime Investigation (DPCI) National Prosecuting Authority (NPA) and the State Security Agency (SSA) hereby submits that:

- In order to address the backlog on trial ready cases and finalise the investigation on 62 cases, the enhanced Multi-Disciplinary Task Team involving SAPS and NPA be extended from 1st April 2021 to 31st March 2022.
- As this is a project based intervention, it is imperative to ensure that the objectives are achieved within the set timeframes with a long term effect on stability and effectiveness of Criminal Justice System.
- There is a potential risk that the 167 court going cases and 80 cases under investigation may collapse if the current Task Team withdraws without them being finalized.
- In terms of the National Intelligence Estimate (NIE) and the submission by the State Security Agency (SSA) at the National Steering Committee meeting, the incidents of political related cases are expected to increase between now and the next Local Government Elections in August 2021 as it was the case during the 2016 Local Government Elections.

#### 5. RECOMMENDATIONS

It is recommended that:

- As part of the sustainability plan and stabilisation of all the identified threats as addressed by this intervention be extended from 1<sup>st</sup> April 2021 to 31<sup>st</sup> March 2022 or until directed otherwise by the respective Executive structure that sanctioned the operations.
- The progress report be accepted and the approval for extension be granted for the duration of twelve months (April 2021 to March 2022).
- The estimated budget for R 97 513 356.00 be approved and funded from the National budget and such budget be managed at Division Operational Response Services.
- Additional capacity of detectives possibly those earmarked for Murder and Robbery Units
  be added to deal with cases currently going to court in order to allow investigation to
  continue on other cases that are still under investigation.
- Dedicated prosecution capacity is required to address the firearm related cases in order to deter the norm of viewing firearm related cases as minor offences which results to accused persons being given suspended sentences.
- Due to the number of cases reported on the project driven investigation, an additional capacity of both dedicated investigators and prosecutors is required to focus on project driven investigation and prosecution including the involvement of Organized Crime Unit.
- A dedicated courtroom and magistrates be finalized and be used to address the trial ready cases which will increase the efficiency and effectiveness of the Task Team.

#### 6. CONCLUSION

In conclusion the decision for extension of the Task Team to be taken as soon as possible to allow proper planning and handing over for the success of the team.

REQUEST FOR FINANCIAL APPROVAL 2025-04-01 TO 2025-06-30: NATIONAL TASK TEAM INVESTIGATING POLITICAL RELATED CASES IN KWAZULU-NATAL FOR FINANCIAL YEAR 2025/2026.

### PURPOSE

The purpose of this information note is to obtain financial approval for the extension period from 01st April 2025 until 31st March 2026.

### 2. BACKGROUND

In December 2024 Minister of Police issued a directive to the National Commissioner regarding the disestablishment of the National Political Killings Task Team.

Various meetings have been held and a detailed progress report submitted to the Minister of Police. On 2025-03-06 a draft disbandment plan was presented to the Minister of Police which was then approved.

It was agreed that in order to avoid adverse effect and unnecessary civil claims and to ensure continuity of cases particularly those that are under investigation and those that are in court, the disestablishment and or disbandment will take a form of a phased-out approach as follows:

- The 125 (60 Political related, 46 Traditional leadership related, 16 Parallel cases, 2 UFH cases and 1 Adhoc case), case dockets which are under investigation and 10 dockets submitted for decision are to be transferred to KwaZulu Natal and Eastern Cape Serious and Violent Crime (Murder & Robbery Unit) respectively for further investigation.
- The newly reported cases linked with the National Political Killings Task Team's Mandate shall be referred to the KwaZulu Natal Serious and Violent Crimes Unit (within Murder & Robbery Unit).

- The 297 finalised, 57 withdrawn and 9 unfounded dockets to be returned to the stations of origin for filling purposes.
- The 114 dockets (60 Political Related cases, 20 Parallel cases, 17 Adhoc
  cases, 14 UFH cases, and 3 Traditional Leadership related cases) that are on
  the court roll will remain with the investigating officers in KZN and Eastern Cape
  until the finalisation of the prosecution processes. This will mean the gradual
  withdrawal of the remaining members until all cases are finalised.

#### STRENGTH OF THE TEAM

J.

The 63 remaining Multi-disciplinary Team members as at 2025-04-01 shall oversee the 114 court going dockets and continue with the outstanding investigation in preparation for trial, as and when each case gets finalised, the dedicated detective and combat member will withdraw and return to their respective stations.

- The 22 Detectives shall be responsible for the cases currently at court.
- Due to the high-risk nature and threat levels of these investigations, the investigation
   Team (22 Detectives and 15 Prosecutors are allocated 33 Combat Members) for security and protection purposes.
- The five (5) commanders to monitor the cases in court and provide command and control.
- The three (3) Analysts (Digital forensic, LCRC and Call Data) to finalise their analysis and section 212 statements for the cases at court.
- The two (2) administration personnel to be responsible for the financial admin and fleet management related administration.
- The two (2) guards are to safeguard the operational centre.

From 2025-05-01, another 9 members will be withdrawn as the handing over will be completed, which will mean 54 members will be remaining as at 2025-05-01

# BRIEFING TO THE PRESIDENT OF SOUTH AFRICA

# INVESTIGATION AND PROSECUTION OF POLITICAL RELATED CASES

16 MARCH 2024

#### INTRODUCTION



- The escalation of Politically related incidents in KwaZulu Natal up to 2018 led to the President establishing the Inter Ministerial Committee (IMC) consisting of the ministries of State Security Agency, Defence, Justice and Correctional Services and Police.
- The Committee is chaired by the Minister of Police and is tasked with ensuring that the perpetrators of politically related cases in KwaZulu Natal are brought to book.
- After the assessment of the then Task Team investigating these cases by the IMC, one of preliminary observations was that the Task Team was working in silos and that it did not have an investigation and prosecutorial plan or strategy.
- The Provincial Commissioner of Police in KwaZulu Natal was then tasked to develop the Strategy for Investigation and Prosecution of Politically Related cases in the Province which was subsequently approved and the Integrated Multi-disciplinary Task Team consisting of SAPS and NPA supported by SSA and Correctional Services was then established in July 2018 to implement the approved plan.
- As of July 2018 the team is allocated and accounts for 329 dockets of politically related cases in line with the approved criteria inclusive of the 134 cases that were reported since 2011 to June 2018 before the commencement of the Task Team, i.e.(162 x Murder, 52 x Attempted Murder, 77 x Intimidation, 12 x Conspiracy to commit murder and 26 other cases).
- As an effort to reduce the political cases and the proliferation of firearms within the province of KwaZulu Natal, the Task Team is also investigating parallel cases which are not related to the Task Team's mandate but linked with allocated politically related cases with similar suspect and ballistic analysis. Thus far a total of 84 parallel cases have been registered.
- Over and above the allocated and parallel cases, the Task Team continues to conduct intelligence-driven operations targeting unlicensed firearms which has resulted in 85 cases registered with a total of 254 unlicensed firearms recovered.
- The report will also highlight the status of the arrested suspects and recovered firearms.
  - Total suspects arrested and charged are 364 and the team recovered a total of 45 firearms from suspects which ballistically links to
    politically related cases.






#### HOTSPOT REGIONS ON POLITICALLY RELATED CASES



Prior to the establishment of the Task Team, one of preliminary observations was that the cases were not properly investigated which led to the suspects not being arrested and most of these cases were closed undetected, withdrawn and referred for inquest.

Since the implementation of the investigation and prosecution strategy approved by the IMC in 2018 which is centred around the Integrated Multi-disciplinary Approach, as a result most of the regions have been stabilised.










### YEALY STATISTICAL COMPARISION ON CASES REPORTED FROM 2011 TO **MARCH 2024**











## MOTIVES FOR POLITICAL KILLINGS



- Prior and After any Local Government Elections murder reported were mainly as a result of fighting over Councillorship positions where Candidate Councillors were eliminated.
- Infightings within branches and municipalities over positions between newly appointed Councillors and Old Councillors, Old Branch Executive Committee members and New Branch Executive Committee members, and also Business Forums over community development projects/tenders.
- Elimination of Ward and PR Councillor of a municipality with the aim of decreasing the existing numbers to be able to win over the municipality.
- Elimination of political figures by a spouse or family members with an objective of monetary gain.
- Conflict between Local Municipality officials and Traditional leadership over land disputes and corruption.
- Tension within political parties is due to the unstable coalition governance as some of the political parties are using this strategy as a political battle ground which negatively affects service delivery within the municipalities. Motion of no confidence.
- This unstable political coalition poses a threat to the upcoming National Government Elections as it might influence the same ideology
  of possible coalition governance at National Level.

- The 67 accused found guilty on politically related cases ( 42 Murder, 3 Attempted Murder, 13 Intimidation, 2 Extortion, 1 Malicious damage to property, 3 Assault GBH, 1 Possession of unlicensed firearm and ammunition and 1 Hijacking) on 52 cases (29 Murder, 1 Attempted Murder, 15 Intimidation, 3 Assault GBH, 1 MITP, 1 Possession of unlicensed firearm and ammunition, 1 Hijacking and 1 Extortion).
  - -Life sentences (15 accused) 6 Accused sentenced to more than 1 life sentence
  - -10 to 65 years (28 accused)
  - -1 to 9 years (16 accused)
  - -Alternative Dispute Resolution (ADR) (4 accused i.e. intimidation and Assault GBH)
  - -4 accused awaiting sentencing
- The 11 accused arrested and charged on parallel cases were found guilty (4 Murder, 5 possession of unlicensed firearm, 1 possession of ammunition and 1 theft of cellphone) on 18 Cases (9 Murder, 6 possession of unlicensed firearm, 2 possession of ammunition and 1 theft of cellphone)
  - Life sentences (3 accused)

#### NOTEWORTHY CONVICTIONS



- Fisokuhle Nkani Ntuli (Notorious Hitman): found guilty and sentenced to a total of 189 years imprisonment for the murder of ANC Cllr Thami Nyembe and 5 others on 6 counts of murder (6 x life sentences), 2 counts of possession of unlicensed firearm (25 years imprisonment; i.e. 15 and 10 years), 2 counts of possession of ammunition (4 years imprisonment) and 1 count of attempted murder (10 years imprisonment). In terms of Section 276B of Act 51 of 1997, the accused Fisokuhle Nkani Ntuli will be considered for release on parole after serving a period of 25 years. All sentences of the accused person will run concurrently and he was declared unfit to possess a firearm.
- Mfana Ngubane (Notorious Hitman): found guilty and sentenced to a total of 136 years imprisonment for the murder of ANC Clir Durnisani Moyo and one other on 11 counts (2 x life sentences), 2 counts of murder, 2 counts of unlawful possession of unlicensed firearm (30 years imprisonment) 2 counts of unlawful possession of ammunition (8 years imprisonment) and 1 count of Conspiracy to commit murder (10 years imprisonment), 2 counts of robbery (30 years imprisonment) and 1 count house breaking and kidnapping (8 years imprisonment). Accused appealed his sentence and it was dismissed.
- Nkosingiphile Gumede (Hitman): found guilty and sentenced to a total of 135 years imprisonment for the murder of ANC Clir Sibusiso Maphumulo and 2 other on 7 counts, 3 counts of Murder (3 x life sentence), 1 count of Attempted Murder (15 years imprisonment), 1 count of unlawful possession of firearm (15 years imprisonment), 1 count of unlawful possession of ammunition (15 years imprisonment) and 1 count of Robbery (15 years imprisonment).
- □ Thabani Ngcobo (Notorious Hitman): found guilty and sentenced to a total of 73 years imprisonment for the murder of IFP member Simosakhe Zungu and one other on 4 counts; count 1 murder (15 years imprisonment), count 2 murder (life sentence), count 3 attempted murder (8 years imprisonment) and count 4 murder (life sentence). All sentences of the accused person will run concurrently.

#### **NOTEWORTHY CONVICTIONS**



- Felokwakhe Ndiovu (Induna of Kwandengezi area) found guilty and sentenced to a total of 70 years imprisonment with three other accused for the murder of ANC Branch Chairperson Thulani Nxumalo on 4 counts (1 x Murder (life sentence), 1 x Conspiracy to commit murder (life sentence), 1 x count of possession of prohibited firearm (15 years imprisonment) and 1 x possession of ammunition (5 years imprisonment). All counts to run concurrently.
- Thembelani Headmen Dlamini (Notorious Hitman, former police officer, turned politician IFP/NFP Official): found guilty and sentenced to a total of 65 years for the murder of Mmeli Xaba on 5 counts; 1 count murder (1 x life sentence), 1 count of attempted Murder (5 years imprisonment), 1 count of possession of unlicensed firearm (15 years imprisonment, 1 count of possession of ammunition (5 years imprisonment) and 1 count of extortion (15 years imprisonment). All sentences of the accused person will not run concurrently and he was declared unfit to possess a firearm. During 2016 Local Government Elections he contested for elections as an NFP candidate, he lost the elections and was allegedly involved in the killing of the ANC Councillor Alwin Houston, matter is currently under investigation.
- Sphamandla Ngcobo (Hitman): found guilty and sentenced to a total of 63 years imprisonment for the murder of ANC member Nandipha Bongekile Khema on 6 counts (1 x life sentence) 1 count of Murder, 1 count of Attempted Murder (10 years imprisonment), 1 count of unlawful possession of firearm (10 years imprisonment) 1 count unlawful possession of ammunition (15 years imprisonment) and 1 count Theft (3 year imprisonment).
- Thanda Chamane (Hitman): found guilty and sentenced to a total of 42 years imprisonment for the murder of IFP Clir Mfazo Nzuza on 3 counts; count 1 murder (life imprisonment), count 2 possession of unlicensed firearm (13 years imprisonment), count 3 possession of ammunition (4 years imprisonment), the sentences will run concurrently. Accused 2 Khumkani Gumede found guilty and sentenced on 2 counts, possession of unlicensed firearm and ammunition (13 years imprisonment).

- Nkosinathi Mantengu (Land Grabber): found guilty and sentenced to a total of 36 years imprisonment for the murder of IFP member Philangenkosi Nkundlane and his son Bongani on 3 counts; Count 1 Murder, sentenced to 15 years imprisonment, Count 2 Murder, sentenced to 18 years imprisonment and Count 3 assault common and kidnapping, sentenced to 3 years imprisonment.
- □ Ntathakusa Dladla (Hitman): found guilty and sentenced to a total of 30 years imprisonment for the murder of Sandile and Mthokozisi Ndimande on 2 counts; count 1 murder (15 years imprisonment), count 2 murder (15 years imprisonment), both sentences will run concurrently. He was also declared unfit to possess a firearm.
- Mxolisi Mzokhona Gcabashe (Hitman) was found guilty and sentenced to a total of 28 years for the murder of ANC CIIr Minenhle Mkhize 1 x Murder (life sentence), 2 x counts of possession of unlicensed firearm (20 years imprisonment), 2 x counts of possession of ammunition (5 years imprisonment) and 1 x count of Contravention of Section 36 (3 years imprisonment). The sentences will run concurrently with life imprisonment.
- Ntsazane Mthetiswa, Gutshana Zwelandile, Mcobhoti Aphelile and Ntsethe Bonasile (ANC members) were found guilty and sentenced to life imprisonment 25 years each for the murder EFF member Mbhobo Sbusiso.
- Thabiso Zulu (ANC Activist) paid R5000.00 to the complainant Ms Makamu who is also an ANC member and was pregnant at the time of the incident, the matter was settled through Alternative Dispute Resolution.

## UPDATE ON ARRESTED OF HIT ORDERS AND HIGH PROFILE INDIVIDUALS



- ANC Councillor Nkosinathi Gambu was arrested and charged with other four accused for the murder of former ANC Ward Councillor Qashana Mchunu. The matter is set for trial from 2024-03-26 for trial. The five accused were initially denied bail and later granted bail of R10 000-00 each at High Court.
- The tenderpreneur and Chairperson of UMkhanyakude Business Forum Nkosibeyiphika Elijah Mkhwanazi was arrested and charged joining the other three accused for the murder of IFP member and tenderpreneur Thelumusa Mahlaba as per Kwamsane CAS 88/08/2022 and murder of IFP member and tenderpreneur Siyabonga Sizwe "Sizuzalo" Mthiyane as per Mtubatuba CAS 140/08/2022. Elijah Mkhwanazi orchestrated their killing after disagreements during business forum meetings regarding tender issues. He appeared before court and his matter was remanded to 2024-04-03 for indictment.
- The two tenderpreneurs Thokozani Tokyo Dlamini and Comfort Mqwembe Mdlalose linked to the Chairperson of King Cetshwayo District Municipality Vika Biyela were arrested and charged for the four murders as per Eshowe CAS 241/06/2022, Eshowe CAS 75/08/2022, Eshowe CAS 39/09/2022 and Eshowe CAS 55/09/2022 Murder of former IFP Ward Councillor where they were eliminating competition in both taxis and tenders. The matter has since been remanded to 2024-09-07 for trial.
- ANC Councillor Mkhipheni Mzimuni Ngiba has since been arrested and charged with other four accused for the murder of ANC Councillor Candidate Siyabonga Mkhize and ANC Supporter Mzukisi Nyanga during the campaigning for the 2021 Local Government Elections. The five accused have since been denied bail and the matter remanded to 2024-03-20 for attorney.
- ANC Councillor Themba Mnguni was arrested and charged with other five accused for the murder of three ANC Members and attempted murder of five other community members who were about to vote for their preferred councillor candidate for the 2021 Local Government Elections as per Inanda CAS 227/09/2021. The matter was remanded to 2024-06-18 to 2024-06-21 for trial. The six accused were granted bail of R5000-00 each.

## UPDATE ON ARRESTED HIT ORDERERS AND HIGH PROFILE INDIVIDUALS



- ANC Councillor Thulani Holi Shozi was arrested and charged with one other for the murder of ANC Youth League Secretary
  Kingdom Thamsanqa Gcabashe and two Metro police officials Lindokuhle Madonsela and Ndumiso Thusi. The matter is set for trial
  from 2024-08-23 for trial One accused is still in custody, Thulani Holi Shozi is on R2 500-00 bail.
- Tenderpreneur and ANC member Mbulelo Mpofana was arrested and charged with other three accused for the murder of former ANC
   Youth League Secretary General Sindiso Magaqa. The matter was remanded to 2024-05-08 for attorney. The four accused were initially denied bail and three were later granted bail of R5 000-00 each at High Court. One accused is still in custody.
- The former ANC Ladysmith Mayor Vincent Madlala was arrested and charged for obstructing and defeating the ends of justice as well as being in unauthorised possession of his daughters firearms. Mayor Madlala was obstructing justice during the arrest of his two sons who are involved in the killing of his former body guard and his two friends. His daughter was also charged for Contravention of Firearms Control Act, their matter was remanded to 2024-04-04 for trial. Accused was granted bail of R10 000-00.
- The notorious hitman Siyanda Wiseman Thusi who is a taxi owner has since been arrested and charged with three others for the murder of IFP PR Clir Mr Robert Sibani Mdletshe who was a complainant/victim on Sundumbili CAS 69/12/2019 attempted murder where Siyanda Wiseman Thusi and others were also charged. The matter was remanded to 2024-04-15 for pre trial conference. Two accused were granted bail of R50 000-00 and R25 000-00, the other two accused are still in custody.
- Deputy Director of Engineering at Umvoti Municipality Nomaswazi Shabalala was arrested and charged with three others for the
  murder of Director of Engineering at Umvoti Municipality of Oscar Hlatshwayo. The matter was remanded to 2024-04-15 for trial.
  All four accused are still in custody.

#### Nongoma Project: Elimination of NFP Councillors

From June 2023 NFP Councillor within Nongoma municipality were targeted with the aim of eliminating them in order for the former ruling party to regain power again, 4 cases were reported (3 Murder and 1 Attempted Murder), thus far 3 of these cases are court going and accused have been denied bail.

#### **Eshowe Project**: Business Forum Tenders

Four cases were reported from July 2022 to September 2022 Lindokuhle Nxumalo, Thabani Biyela, Snamandla Mbhamali, Phelelani Khuzwayo and Reginald Ngema shot and killed by the same syndicate of hitman, spotters and coordinators who were sourced to eliminate identified individual within Eshowe area. Six 6 accused have been arrested and charged on 5 counts of Murder and two counts of attempted murder. Bail was denied.

#### Mtubatuba Project: Business Forum Tenders

Two IFP members were shot and killed with a few days apart after a disagreement with a Business Forum chairperson in Mtubatuba area, two suspects including the hit order were arrested and charged, one accused is out on R10 000 bail and the other bail was denied.

#### **Mpophomeni Project**: Theft of Electricity

The Murder of a DA Councillor Mr Ndlovu resulted in the identification of 6 other murder cases that have since been linked ballistically, 2 suspects were arrested and charged whilst and ball was denied.





#### UNIVERSITY OF FORT HARE CASES



- January 2017 the University of Fort Hare appointed Professor Sakhele Buhlungu as the Vice Chancellor, soon after his appointment investigation on majority of officials involved in corruption within the University were instituted as part of the renewal campaign, which resulted in the institution being ungovernable due riots caused by students and staff. This led to the Smear campaign phase against the Vice Chancellor.
- July 2018 Dr Tladi Human Resource Director was appointed, Professor Buhlungu related his frustration regarding the Institution and he also shared the unwillingness of staff to support his endeavours. Professor Buhlungu asked to partner with him to eradicate the scourge of corruption and lawlessness in the Institution. He agreed to partner with Professor Buhlungu.
- April 2019 the UFH council was dissolved by Minister Pandor. Prof Nongxa was appointed as the administrator by the Minister in place of a council.
- May 2019 Isaac Plaatjies was appointed as the manager in the transformation within the HR department.
- A turnaround plan was set out by the independent assessor to combat fraud, as a result in February 2020, investigation and vetting unit was set up, and relationship was developed with law enforcement Hawks and SIU and a forensic company New Horizons. Isaac Plaatijes was then appointed as the Director of the unit.
- As from December 2020 Isaac Plaatjies have been receiving payments from the UFH's service providers which are linked to the HR Department together with Dr Tladi.
- March 2022 to April 2022 was the intimidation phase, which was carried out in two ways, with the intension to induce fear in the community of UFH, 1) shooting incidents where the properties of the Vice Chancellor and some of the staff members were targeted, 2) threatening messages sent consisting of a "hit-list" with names and amounts of UFH employees to be eliminated.



#### UNIVERSITY OF FORT HARE CASES



- It was during this period that Isaac Plaatjies unit initiated deviation processes in upgrading and securing additional security forces for the executive and staff and successfully managed to get a budget of R 8 Million towards security services from the MEC (Management Executive Committee).
- 19 May 2022 Petrus Roets was shot and killed execution style.
- 20 May 2022 Pent Pentagon Group of Companies started rendering services at the UFH without following normal SCM processes as it
  was a matter of urgency.
- June 2022 from the very first payment made by the UFH to Pentagon Group of Companies Isaac Plaatjies received a payment from the service provider.
- 6 months later (December 2022) funds were depleted as R14 453 890 was already spent, the services of Pentagon Group of Companies were due for re-evaluation and threat assessment.
- In ensuring that MEC rules in favour of Pentagon Group of Companies service being extended and additional budget allocated, the driver and protector of the Vice Chancellor is shot and killed in the same way Petrus Roets was killed in January 2023.
- As from January 2023 to date Pentagon has received more payments over 19 millions rands.
- When Vesele was killed a hit-list was found in the vehicle used to kill which was found abandoned.
- Investigation proved that Isaac Plaatjies's phone is the source of the hit-list which had both the photo's of Petrus Roets and Vesele amongst others including his photo.
- Isaac Plaatjies communicated with the hitmen on the day of killing of Vesele, before during and after.
- Investigation further reveals that the hitmen he communicated with is the author of the hot-list found in the car.
- In conclusion Isaac Plaatjies benefited from five (5) service providers and has received a more than 7 million (R 7 695 440)
- Isaac Plaatjies was working with his syndicate which has since been identified and he has been making payments to in order to keep their corrupt operation going.
- These employees being the Finance manager, Supply Chain manager, Manage in the office of the VC, IT specialist, Security supervisors and his Personal assistant. Investigation has successfully prove that they also received payments others directly from the service provider and Isaac Plaatjies.

#### **UNIVERSITY OF FORT HARE CASES**

- The smear campaign against the Vice Chancellor, the intimidation and threats were used by Isaac Plaatjies as an opportunity to acquire services of various service provides without following normal supply chain processes.
- Which the enabled money laundering and great deal of corruption by Isaac Plaatjies and his syndicate.
- Isaac Plaatjies and his syndicate have benefited from more than five (5) service providers linked to HR and Investigation departments, which he is heading and Dr Tladi respectively.
- To date 10 accused (3 on bail ,7 in custody) are charged for the murder and attempted murder cases, this includes three (3) of the former employees of UFH. The matter is set to appear at Bisho High court on the 8th October 2024.
- In as far as the corruption and money laundering investigation is concern a total of 13 suspects have been identified and successfully linked, the docket is with the NPA for issuing of the warrant of arrests.

REQUEST FOR FINANCIAL AUTHORITY FOR 2024/2025: NATIONAL TASK TEAM INVESTIGATING POLITICAL RELATED CASES IN KWAZULU-NATAL

- The escalation of political related killings in KwaZulu Natal up to 2018 led to the President of the Republic of South Africa establishing the Inter Ministerial Committee (IMC) consisting of Ministries of State Security Agency, Defence, Police, Justice and Correctional Services. The Committee is chaired by the Minister of Police and is tasked with ensuring that the perpetrators of politically related incidents are brought to book.
- 2. The Multi-Disciplinary Task Team consisting of the South African Police Service (SAPS), National Prosecuting Authority (NPA), State Security Agency (SSA) and Department of Justice and Correctional Services (DJ&CS) was then established by the IMC to develop implement the strategy for the investigation and prosecution of politically related cases in the province effective from July 2018.
- 3. The strategy implemented by the Task Team which is centred around analysis-led and prosecution-driven organised crime investigation approach has been proven to be a great success in the effective investigation of contract killings which does not only results in the arrest and prosecution on only hitmen but the entire groupings and syndicates.
- 4. The achievements, performance and successes of the Task Team has been found to be outstanding during the continuous evaluations by the National Steering Committee, the Inter-Ministerial Committee and the President of the Republic. The current phase of the Task Team was approved up until 2024-03-31.
- The decision has been taken to extend the period of the National Task Team and the appointment of Lieutenant General S D Khumalo as the Project Manager for the financial year 2024/2025 due to the following reasons:

- The mandate of the Task Team has been extended with effect from 1 April 2024 to include the investigation of cases involving the killings of Traditional Leaders in KwaZulu Natal
- There are also other parallel major investigations that are still on-going like killings at the University of Fort Hare in the Eastern Cape that the Task Team was directed to conduct.
- There is a potential risk that the court going politically related cases especially the 49 trial ready and 82 cases under investigation may collapse if the current Task Team withdraws without them being finalized.
- As this is a project based intervention, it is imperative to ensure that the objectives are achieved within the set timeframes with a long term effect on stability and effectiveness of Criminal Justice System.
- The incidents of political related cases are expected to increase between now and the next General Elections in 2024 due to the unstable coalition governance as most municipalities within KZN are affected

# INVESTIGATION AND PROSECUTION OF POLITICAL RELATED CASES PROGRESS REPORT

**03 AUGUST 2018** 

BRIEFING TO THE INTER-MINISTERIAL COMMITTEE

1









- The Joint NPA/SAPS planning meetings on 4, 5 and 11 June 2018 was conducted to prepare a Joint Project Plan
  encompassing strategy to effectively investigate and prosecute Political related cases.
- The NPA identified experienced prosecutors who have been dedicated to guide investigations and prosecution of all politically related cases in KwaZulu Natal. To date, the DPP office has created a NPA Task Team comprising of 3 Chief Prosecutors, 1 Senior Deputy Director of Public Prosecutions, 1 Senior Public Prosecutor and Administrative Support.
- The DPP office issued an Internal Directive focused on the implementation of the strategies in the joint Project Plan and is currently reviewing the cases under investigation.
- The DPP Directive stipulates that all cases involving offences, either perpetrated by a person(s) linked to a political party or against a person(s) linked to a political party must be referred to the DPP office within 3 days of the matter being enrolled by the dedicated prosecutors. Further SAPS have undertaken that in all other politically related cases the Investigating Officers must personally take the dockets to the dedicated prosecutors within 3 days.
- Important interventions encompassed in the DPP Directive are that witnesses must be interviewed within 21 days or whilst these cases are still pending in the district courts at the very least and that no politically related case may be withdrawn without the written authorization from the DPP office.
- The SAPS initiated a Multi-disciplinary Task Team dedicated for the project which was established on the 1st of July 2018 which will work in conjunction with NPA dedicated team.

## INTRODUCTION



- The Joint Team commenced its work on the 5<sup>th</sup> of July 2018 with TacJOC Commanders going through the case dockets
- The Task Team members started to report from the 9<sup>th</sup> of July 2018
- The approach is based on the tried and tested method of integrating operational processes, resources, competencies, capabilities and intelligence from all operational environments of SAPS with dedicated and CENTRALISED COMMAND STRUCTURE in order to address the identified threat in a result driven and holistic manner, and is implemented as follows:
  - > Core Command Structure (Joint Operation Committee (JOCOM)
  - > Operational Command & Co-ordination Structure (Mission Area Joint Operational Centre (MAJOC)
  - > Tactical Command Structure (Tactical Joint Operational Centre (TACJOC)
- All members of the Task Team are assigned to their respective operational areas (Mission Area Joint Operational Centre), situated in Durban and manageable action areas (Tactical Joint Operational Centres) in the North Coast, Midlands, Central and South Coast Regions of the province.





## INTRODUCTION



- The established integrated operational teams per TacJOC are inclusive of the following disciplines:
  - ➤ Crime Intelligence Collectors, NIU Information officers, Tracking Team members and Analysts to implement **Pillar: 1** (Intelligence gathering, coordination and analysis).
  - Members from DPCI, Detective Services and Forensic Services to implement Pillar: 2 (Investigation including Organised Crime Approach).
  - NIU and TRT operatives to implement Pillar: 3 (Combat and Reaction Approach).
- Currently there is synergy between the DPP's office and SAPS in terms of maintaining an updated database, the
  allocation of dedicated prosecutors who work closely with the investigating officers and joint implementation
  of the Project Plan.
- The aim of this presentation is to highlight the status/progress regarding cases received and operational feedback implemented as from 9 to 29 July 2018, within the KwaZulu Natal when addressing political related cases.






## **OPERATIONAL COORDINATION**



- Tactical Joint Operational Centre (TACJOC) Commanders are meeting on daily basis to inspect dockets and direct operations in accordance with taskings from the Mission Area Joint Operational Centre (MAJOC).
- Tactical Joint Operational Centre (TACJOC) Commanders and Mission Area Joint Operational Center (MAJOC)
  meet on weekly basis (Mondays) to check on the progress of the investigations and direct operations in
  accordance with taskings given by the Provincial Joint Operational Coordinating Committee (PROVJOCCOM).
- Mission Area Joint Operational Center (MAJOC) briefs the Provincial Joint Operational Coordinating Committee (PROVJOCCOM) comprising of the Provincial Commissioner South African Police Service, the Director of Public Prosecution, the Provincial Manager State Security Agency and the Regional Commissioner of Correctional Services on the status and progress of the cases bi-weekly.
- The chairperson of PROVJOCCOM (Provincial Commissioner KZN) briefs the National Joint Operational Coordinating Committee (NATJOCCOM) comprising of National Commissioner SAPS, National Head DPCI, Deputy National Commissioner Detection, Deputy National Commissioner Policing and National Director of Prosecutions monthly.
- The National Commissioner South African Police Service briefs the Inter-Ministerial Committee (IMC) on the status and progress of the cases monthly.










# CASES DISTRIBUTION ACCORDING TO REGIONS 126



#### INTRODUCTION

- When the Task Team was established, a total of 98 case dockets were allocated and currently the number has increased to 137 case dockets. The dockets are constantly increasing as new cases are reported and other old cases that were not part of the initial report are referred to the Task Team as required by the approved criteria.
- The purpose of this presentation is to provide progress report of the Integrated Multidisciplinary Task Team on Investigation and Prosecution of Political Related Cases in KwaZulu Natal from inception to date (5 July 2018 to 12 September 2018).
- The report will highlight the number of cases allocated, arrested suspects and status
  of investigation and prosecution of all allocated dockets.

**Note**: The investigation of the above case dockets is showing a good progress. The continuous Prosecutor Guided Investigation (PGI) sessions between prosecutors and investigators are having positive impact on the investigation.

The Task Team has placed much emphasis on the three prioritised cases by the Inter-Ministerial Committee (IMC) i.e. Plessislaer CAS 233/5/2018, Richmond CAS 20/3/2017 and Ibisi CAS 54/7/2017 all Murder cases. The investigation on these priority cases is at the advanced stage as a result Plessislaer CAS 233/05/2018 has been moved to court going dockets after the arrest of the suspects.

Some of the case dockets including the cases prioritised by the IMC are on the final stage of investigation.



### CONCLUSION



- Over and above the allocated political related cases, the Task Team is conducting intelligence-driven
  operations which have led to 30 arrested suspects on 30 cases and 21 firearms were recovered. In
  relation to the above cases 26 dockets are court going and 4 are under investigation.
- A total of 22 case dockets not related to the Task Team mandate but linked with allocated political related cases are taken by the Task Team for parallel investigation. These two categories of cases are also allocated to the Task Team to ensure centralised investigation and prosecution.
- The Task Team is now familiar with most of the dockets and has been able to prioritize them in terms of
  phases of investigation. There has been an increase on suspects arrested and firearms confiscated. Two
  cases has been finalised with conviction within a week (arrest to sentencing) and the majority of the
  arrested suspects are denied bail.





### **CONCLUSION Cont...**



The need of fast tracking ballistic and biology analysis, post mortem reports and section 205 analysis remains the priority of the task team in order to link the suspects with the crime scenes for successful prosecution. Therefore the following is of critical importance:

- Ballistic experts have been called up to be part of the task team.
- Division Forensic Services has been requested to provide for dedicated analysts for DNA.
- ❖ Additional call data analysts will be called up to be part of the task team.
- Department of Health will be included as one of the stake holders in the project.
- The other critical capability that is required for this type of operation is the electronic tracking device of
  which the current available instrument is unable to track a 4g Cellphone and also can no point to the
  exact location of the Cellphone.
- Only with the continued support by all stake holders, and most importantly working together towards a
  common purpose by the South African Justice System, the Task Team will be able to effectively
  investigate, prosecute and convict on these cases and thereby creating stability in the political
  environment of the province and the country at large.

#### INTRODUCTION



- The Integrated Multi-disciplinary Task Team on Investigation and Prosecution of Politically Related Cases in KwaZulu Natal was established in July 2018.
- As of 28 March 2019 the team is allocated and accounts for 163 dockets of politically related cases in line with the approved criteria which includes 31 new cases reported after the formation of the task team (8 Murder, 2 Attempted Murder, 15 Intimidation, 2 x Conspiracy to commit murder, 1 each of Defeating the ends of justice, Arson, House robbery and Malicious damage to property).
- In addition, a total of 77 case dockets not related to the Task Team mandate but linked with allocated political related cases are taken by the Task Team for parallel investigation.
- Over and above the allocated and parallel politically related cases, the Task Team is conducting intelligence-driven operations targeting unlicensed firearms which have led to 37 arrested suspects on 31 cases and 30 firearms were recovered. These two categories of cases are also allocated to the Task Team to ensure centralised investigation and prosecution
- The report will highlight the breakdown of 163 cases allocated, 77 parallel cases and 31 Adhoc cases including arrested suspects and status of investigation and prosecution of all these cases...



#### **OVERALL PROGRESS REPORT ON ALLOCATED CASES**



- The Task Team is currently allocated 163 dockets of politically related cases in terms of the criteria approved by the Inter-Ministerial Committee.
- The team has successfully decreased the cases under investigation as out of 163 case dockets allocated to the Task Team only 52 are still under investigation, court going cases are (59) and finalized increased to (52).
- The Task Team has moved amongst others the following cases to court:
  - Plessislaer CAS 233/5/2018 Murder of Qashana Mchunu (6 accused),
  - Richmond CAS 20/3/2017 Murder of Sibusiso Sithole (3 accused) and
  - Ibisi CAS 54/7/2017 Murder of Sindiso Magaqa (6 accused).
- Out of eight newly reported murder cases, five have been successfully investigated and were enrolled at court i.e.
  - Umlazi CAS 582/07/2018 murder of ANC Youth League Branch Chairperson Bongani Mhlongo (2 accused),
  - Kwandengezi CAS 13/09/2018 ANC Branch Chairperson Thulani Nxumalo (5 accused),



#### INVOLVEMENT OF PRIVATE SECURITY COMPANIES



- The continuous disregard of the law displayed by private security companies and personnel within the Province of KwaZulu Natal in terms of firearms controls Act is problematic and the continued random inspections conducted is the only solution to combat this gross violation of the law.
- The Task Team has committed to continuously conducting operations against the identified security companies, as majority of the firearms linking to the cases have not yet been recovered. The following security companies were inspected and all firearms confiscated, owners or responsible persons in the companies were arrested and charged.
  - VUCO SECURITY SOLUTIONS
  - GROUND FORCE SUBSIDIARY TO VUKO SECURITY SOLUTIONS
  - MOSHENI COMMUNICATIONS
  - INKUNZI SECURITY
  - LK SECURITY SOLUTIONS
  - WENDLOVU
  - V1 SECURITY
  - SIZOWAKHA SECURITY
- All but two (Mosheni and Sizowakha) identified companies are linked to three (3) cases allocated to the Task Team.
- A total of 13 cases were opened against the responsible persons and 14 suspects were arrested and charged on the cases in terms of Firearms Control Act and PSIRA regulations.
- A total of 377 firearms were confiscated from the above Eight (8) security companies and have since been sent for ballistic testing. These firearms will only be returned back to owners once the investigation is completed or if they are declared unfit the firearms will be destroyed and companies shut down.

## CONCLUSION



- The integrated multi-disciplinary approach has led to the successful investigation and prosecution of allocated politically related cases with their parallel and Adhoc cases.
- The investigation of these cases has confirmed the findings by Moerane Commission that political positions, tenders, greed and corruption has proven to be the motivating factors which lead to most of the killings in the province.
- Most of these cases are planned, executed in an organised manner and involves different role players from a person
  who orders the hit to the coordinator and hitmen which makes it complex or not easy to arrest and prosecute all
  identified suspects.
- The performance of the Task Team has contributed to significantly reduce the number of killings of politicians in the
  KZN Province, especially also now in the run up to the upcoming general elections and has brought back confidence in
  the Criminal Justice System.
- The success of the Task Team is also met by different reactions from the community, others appreciating and others implying the Team is serving certain factions within the ruling party. Regardless of the latter, this Task Team stood its ground and focused on the task at hand that, of serving the country.
- Going forward a strategic assessment will be compiled looking into good practice by the Task Team as well as
  identifying weaknesses in current legislation and departmental policies. Furthermore, the assessment will aim to
  make a case for the establishment of a similarly constituted Task Team to focus on the main root cause of the killings,
  namely rampant corruption and fraud at a local and provincial government level in particular.

## INTRODUCTION




- The escalation of Politically related incidents in KwaZulu Natal up to 2018 led to the President establishing the Inter Ministerial Committee (IMC) consisting of the ministries of State Security Agency, Defence, Justice and Correctional Services and Police.
- The Committee is chaired by the Minister of Police and is tasked with ensuring that the perpetrators of political related cases in KwaZulu Natal are brought to book.
- After the assessment of the then Task Team investigating these cases by the IMC, one of preliminary observation was that the Task Team was working in silos and that it did not have an investigation and prosecutorial plan or strategy.
- The acting Provincial Commissioner of Police in KwaZulu Natal was then tasked to develop the Strategy for Investigation and Prosecution of Political Related cases in the Province which was subsequently approved and the Integrated Multi-disciplinary Task Team consisting of SAPS and NPA supported by SSA and Correctional Services was then established in July 2018 to implement the approved plan.
- As of July 2019 the team is allocated and accounts for 173 dockets of politically related cases in line with the approved criteria which includes 41 new cases reported after the formation of the task team (14 Murder, 2 Attempted Murder, 18 Intimidation, 2 Conspiracy to commit murder, 2 Defeating the ends of justice and 1 each of Arson, House robbery and Malicious damage to property).
- In addition, a total of 78 case dockets not related to the Task Team mandate but linked with allocated politically related cases are taken by the Task Team for parallel investigation.
- Over and above the allocated and parallel politically related cases, the Task Team is conducting intelligence-driven operations targeting unlicensed firearms which have led to 41 arrested suspects on 36 cases and 31 firearms were recovered. These two categories of cases are also allocated to the Task Team to ensure centralised investigation and prosecution.
- The report will highlight the breakdown and status of investigation and prosecution of 173 cases allocated, 78 parallel cases and 36 Adhoc cases including arrested suspects.



#### INVOLVEMENT OF PRIVATE SECURITY COMPANIES



The investigation has revealed in line with the Moerane commission the involvement of some of the security companies which have resulted in the Task Team conducting operations against the identified security companies and municipalities in search of firearms used in the commission of political related cases.
 The Task Team has conducted the firearm compliance inspections on 13 identified security companies and 4 municipalities where firearms were confiscated and owners or responsible persons were arrested and charged.
 A total of 13 cases were opened against the responsible persons and 14 suspects were arrested and charged on the cases in terms of Firearms Control Act and PSIRA regulations.
 The 13 security companies and 4 municipalities are having a total of 1045 as per Central Firearms Control Register (CFR) of which 926 firearms were inspected, 753 firearms were confiscated, 75 firearms were unaccounted for and 44 firearms were reported stolen. All 753 confiscated firearms have since been sent for ballistic testing. These firearms will only be returned back to the security companies and municipalities once the investigation is completed or if they are declared unfit the firearms will subsequently be destroyed.

## **MATTERS OF CONCERN**



- Detection Capacity
  - The increase of allocated cases (173 + 78 + 36) and court going cases (58 + 57 + 23) impacts negatively on the turn around time of investigation as the current number of detectives (30) spend most of the time attending courts.
- The politically related cases especially murder are organised in nature with different role players (Hitmen, Spotters, coordinators and individuals at the top who are ordering the hits) are carefully identified and lots of money being made readily available.
  - This results in the involved <u>Politicians and Business people</u> availing legal fees and assistance for whoever is arrested below them, attempts to bribe the Criminal Justice System personnel, if it fails then attempts to turn section 204 witnesses against the state, if that fails then the state witnesses are killed which results in the cases being withdrawn and makes it difficult for the investigation to reach the top level.
  - Questionable Withdrawal Decisions without reasons, endorsements and queries in the docket
  - The lack of dedicated courts, prosecutors and magistrates which result in delayed decisions, prosecution and trial
  - The repetitive granting of bail to accused who are already on bail.

## The threats against the Task Team members

After two failed attempts to bribe the Task Team members and arrest of high profiled politicians and business people, the Task Team
members started to receive threats against their lives.





## **RECOMMENDATIONS**



- Based on matters of concerns raised the following is recommended:
  - Increased investigation capacity by ten investigating officers
  - Increase combat operators by ten
  - Provide for a dedicated court, four dedicated prosecutors and two presiding officers





## CONCLUSION



- The integrated Multi-Disciplinary Approach has led to the successful investigation and prosecution of allocated politically related cases with their parallel and Adhoc cases.
- The investigation of these cases has confirmed the findings by Moerane Commission that political positions, tenders, greed and corruption has proven to be the motivating factors which lead to most of the killings in the province.
- The performance of the Task Team has contributed significantly in reducing the number of political killings in KwaZulu Natal and has brought back confidence in the Criminal Justice System.
- The success of the Task Team is also met by different reactions from the community, others appreciating and others implying the Team is serving certain factions within the ruling party. Regardless of the latter, this Task Team stood its ground and focused on the task at hand that, of serving the country.


## INTRODUCTION



- The escalation of Politically related incidents in KwaZulu Natat up to 2018 led to the President establishing the Inter Ministerial Committee (IMC) consisting of the ministries of Police, Defence, State Security Agency, Justice and Correctional Services.
- The Committee is chaired by the Minister of Police and is tasked with ensuring that the perpetrators of political related cases in KwaZulu Natal are brought to book.
- The Provincial Commissioner of Police in KwaZulu Natal was then tasked to develop the Strategy for Investigation and Prosecution of Politically Related cases in the Province which was subsequently approved together with the criteria for the politically related cases and the Integrated Multi-disciplinary Task Team consisting of SAPS and NPA supported by SSA and Correctional Services was then established in July 2018 to implement the approved plan.
- The report will highlight the breakdown and status of investigation and prosecution of 436 allocated cases.
- As of June 2021 the team is allocated and accounts for 226 dockets of politically related cases in line with the approved criteria.
- In addition, a total of 69 case dockets not related to the Task Team's mandate but linked with allocated politically related cases with similar suspect and ballistic
  analysis are taken by the Task Team for parallel investigation.
- Over and above the allocated and parallel politically related cases, the Task Team is conducting intelligence-driven operations targeting unlicensed firearms
  which has resulted to a total of 107 cases.
- The team is also conducting compliance inspections at the identified institutions and individuals in terms of Firearm Controls Act 60 of 2000 to recover the used firearms and thus far a total of 34 cases has been registered.










## MURDER VS INTIMIDATION/ EXTORTION CASES FROM 2011 TO DATE

- The 46 accused found guilty (30 murder, 12 intimidation, 2 extortion, 1 Malicious damage to property) on 34 cases of which 19 are murder cases.
  - Life sentences (9 accused)
  - 10 to 50 years (22 accused)
  - 1 to 9 years (12 accused)
  - Alternative Dispute Resolution (ADR) (3 accused i.e. intimidation)
- The concern on ADR is that the two of the three cases involve 1 accused Mr Sigoga Mkhwanazi (Local Business man and Municipality Official)
  - On one of the cases, an Administrator from the KZN Provincial Government (Department of COGTA) Mr Madondo the Local Ministerial Representative who opened a case of intimidation after he uncovered Fraud and Corruption against Mr Sigoga Mkhwanazi. During the trial, the complainant, Mr Madondo was offered an apology and a compensation of R50 000 by the accused Mr Sigoga Mkhwanazi of which he gladly accepted.

# PROJECT DRIVEN INVESTIGATIONS ON IDENTIFIED TRENDS (HITMEN, FIREARMS, AMMUNITION AND INTIMIDATIONS)



- The Team has analysed all allocated politically related cases and the following was established:
  - The cases are interlinked in terms of hitmen, firearms and ammunition used and thus some requires a project driven investigation approach and therefore a man marking strategy was implemented.
  - The team also realised that recovery of the murder weapons was a challenge as hitmen would be arrested and linked, however the firearms used could not be found (Out of 109 murder and 29 attempted murder cases a total of 151 firearms were used). The team has managed to ballistically link 23 firearms out of 207 unlicensed firearms recovered and 2360 firearms seized during compliance inspections. Therefore 128 murder weapons are still outstanding. This led the team in identifying projects to deal with proliferation of firearms with the aim of recovering murder weapons.
  - The amount of shots fired during these killings especially the use of high calibre **ammunition** is an indication that ammunition is easily accessible which resulted in the team investigating the source/supply of ammunition.
  - The identified pattern of increase in murders and decrease in intimidation incidents and vice versa were also analysed and proven which then necessitated the grouping together of these intimidation and extortion cases and be investigated in a project format.
- Therefore these findings led to the initiative of four project driven investigations.

# INVOLVEMENT OF PRIVATE SECURITY COMPANIES, MUNICIPALITIES, GUNSHOPS AND POLICE STATIONS



- The investigation has revealed in line with the Moerane commission the involvement of some of the security companies which have resulted in the Task Team conducting operations against the identified security companies and municipalities in search of firearms used in the commission of political related cases.
- The Task Team has conducted the firearm compliance inspections on 20 identified security companies, 6 municipalities, 1 Gunshop and 1 Police Station where firearms were confiscated and owners or responsible persons were arrested and charged.
- Compliance Inspections were conducted at the identified institutions and 2360 firearms were inspected and seized, 11 firearms were unaccounted for and 163 firearms were reported stolen. All 2360 confiscated firearms have since been sent for ballistic testing. These firearms will only be returned back to the security companies and municipalities once the investigation is completed or if they are declared unfit the firearms will subsequently be destroyed.
- A total of 34 cases were opened against the responsible persons and 41 suspects were arrested and charged on the cases in terms of Firearms Control Act and PSIRA regulations.

## **MATTERS OF CONCERN**



### **CONCERN 1**: Court challenges

- Rotation of prosecutors and magistrates at lower courts
- Inconsistency on decisions and sentences on cases of intimidation/extortion and cases involving firearms
- None implementation of the executive decision for dedicated court

**CONCERN 2**: Political figures reporting false cases continues to emerge during investigation of political related cases which delays the investigation of main cases.

#### **CONCERN 3**: Correctional services

- The illegal access of cellphones to prisoners is a challenge and further prohibits witnesses to testify as they are threatened by prisoners.
- The slow progress of moving incarcerated dangerous hitmen from local correctional facilities to Ebongweni Kokstad Super Max Correctional Centre.
- The parolees who are wanted suspects on politically related cases cannot be located even with the assistance of Correctional Services Parole
  Officers.

#### **CONCERN 4:** Insufficient investigation team

The turn around time of investigation is negatively affected by the increased number of court going dockets which demands investigators to be at court.

## RECOMMENDATIONS



- ☐ It is recommended that:
- The previous decision for a dedicated court (Sawoti Court) is implemented
- Dedicated prosecution team is appointed at lower courts.
- Dedicated magistrate team is appointed at lower courts.
- The IMC to discourage political office bearers more especially Councilors from reporting false cases for their own ulterior motives such as getting more body guards.
- The Department of Correctional Service utilizes network jamming devices in prison especially where inmates are incarcerated and enhance security measures to the level of Ebongweni Kokstad Super Max Correctional Centre.
- The previous decision to move dangerous prisoners from local correctional facilities to Ebongweni Kokstad Super Max Correctional Centre be implemented.
- The management of parolees be enhanced in order to achieve the objective of the parolee program.
- The capacity of the Task Team be enhanced in line with the current workload specifically the court going dockets.


### INTRODUCTION



- The report will highlight the progress and status of all allocated cases since the last Inter Ministerial Committee briefing in June 2021.
- The team is allocated and currently accounts for 258 dockets in line with the approved criteria as compared to the 226 dockets that were previously reported which is an increase of 32 dockets (14 x Murder, 6 x Attempted Murder, 3 x Intimidation, 4 x Conspiracy to commit murder and 5 other cases)
- Most of these cases were reported before, during and after the 2021 Local Government Elections.
- The most affected political parties are ANC, IFP and NFP where the motive have been linked to intra-political conflicts with few cases linked to various motives such as taxi violence and other domestic related issues.
- On Parallel cases which are not related to the Task Team's mandate but linked with allocated politically related cases with similar suspect and ballistic analysis, there is an increase from 69 cases to 116 cases. This increase is as a result of neutralizing the problematic Pietermaritzburg Ntsuntsu Gang that is involved in political, taxi and drug related killings.
- Over and above the allocated and parallel cases, the Task Team continues to conduct intelligence-driven operations targeting unlicensed firearms which has resulted in 172 cases registered as compared to 107 cases. Additional 43 unlicensed firearms were recovered in the process which increases the total to 250 as compared to the 207 reported previously.
- The report will also highlight the status of the arrested suspects and recovered firearms.
  - Total suspects arrested and charged increased from 251 to 289 with 72 still in custody and 43 on bail.
  - The team recovered additional 8 firearms from the arrested suspects which increases the total recovery of firearms ballistically linking to politically related cases to 31 as compared to 23.



# YEARLY STATISTICAL COMPARISON ELECTION YEARS 2016 VS 2021: POLITICAL RELATED CASES









#### SENTENCES ON ACCUSED FOUND GUILTY



- The 47 accused found guilty (31 Murder, 13 Intimidation, 2 Extortion, 1 Malicious damage to property) on 36 cases (18 Murder, 16 Intimidation, 1 MITP and 1 Extortion).
  - Life sentences (10 accused)
  - 10 to 50 years (22 accused)
  - 1 to 9 years (12 accused)
  - Alternative Dispute Resolution (ADR) (3 accused i.e. intimidation)

#### □ RECENT NOTEWORTHY CONVICTIONS

- Fisokuhle Nkani Ntuli (Notorious Hitman): found guilty and sentenced on 6 counts of murder (6 x life sentences) of which one is for the killing of the late ANC Councilor Thami Nyembe, 2 counts of possession of unlicensed firearm (25 years imprisonment; i.e. 15 and 10 years), 2 counts of possession of ammunition (4 years imprisonment) and 1 count of attempted murder (10 years imprisonment). In terms of Section 276B of Act 51 of 1977, the accused Fisokuhle Nkani Ntuli will be considered for release on parole after serving a period of 25 years.
- Nkosinathi Mantengu (Land Grabber and Hitman): found guilty on 3 counts; Count 1 Murder of IFP member and Taxi owner Philangenkosi Nkundlane, sentenced to 15 years imprisonment, Count 2 Murder of Mr Nkundlane's son, sentenced to 18 years imprisonment and Count 3 assault common and kidnapping, sentenced to 3 years imprisonment.

# **OVERALL PROGRESS REPORT ON HIGH PROFILE CASES**



- Plessislaer CAS 233/05/2018 Murder of Qashana Mchunu former ANC Ward Councillor (7 suspects were arrested: 1 charged for murder, 4 charged for conspiracy to commit murder and 2 charges were withdrawn against them) Trial date 2022-02-04.
- Ibisi CAS 54/07/2017 Murder of Sindiso Magaqa former ANC Youth League Secretary General (8 suspects were arrested : 5 charged for murder, 1 deceased and 2 charges were withdrawn against them) Trial date 2022-07-15.
- Newcastle CAS 208/05/2019 Murder of Martin Sithole ANC Activist which is linked to Madadeni CAS 149/05/2016 Murder (2 suspects were arrested and charged; Trial date 2022-11-12.
- Umlazi CAS 487/10/2018 Murder of ANC Ward Councillor Sbusiso Maphumulo (3 suspects were arrested and charges were withdrawn against them due to the witnesses turning against the state. Further investigation led to the arrest of one suspect who was found with the murder weapon) Trial date 2022-05-22.
- Ezakheni CAS 03/09/2020 Murder of Mayor's body guard and his two friends (5 suspects were arrested and charged; remanded for indictments to 2022-03-30).

# IDENTIFIED CHALLENGES IN RELATION TO FIREARMS USED IN THESE CASES



- These cases are mainly committed using firearms which are easily accessible to the perpetrators.
- As of 2014 to date a total of 175 firearms were used to commit 114 murder cases and 37 attempted murder cases
- The recovery of used firearms/ murder weapons is of great concern as out of 175 firearm used, only 31 firearms were recovered and positively linked to political related cases.
- The investigation has since revealed that the sources of these firearms are amongst others the following:
  - Private Security Companies
  - Municipalities
  - Deceased Estates
  - Illegitimate firearm "owners"
- The team then conducted various operations aimed at recovering the outstanding murder weapons targeting the identified individuals and institutions from the above categories.
- The prosecution of the arrested suspects (Private Security owners and responsible persons) is faced with various challenges e.g. submission of representations for their release, submission of court interdicts against the police and not complying with the NDPP decision to prosecute, which delays the finalisation and results in them not prosecuted.

# IDENTIFIED CHALLENGES IN RELATION TO FIREARMS USED IN THESE CASES



- The <u>Designated Firearm Officers</u> illegally processing firearm licences to individuals who have criminal records, pending cases and have never been trained on the use and maintenance of firearms.
- Unlawfully handing over by DFO's of the deceased estate firearms to unlicensed dealerships which were voluntarily surrendered by the executors.
- Unlawful possession of deceased firearms by family members which results in <u>inconsistent prosecution</u> decisions, like referring firearm related cases to NICRO programmes, not opposing bail and withdrawing cases without reasonable explanation.
- Lastly the sentences imposed by the magistrate on the accused persons arrested on firearm related matters are inconsistent as in some cases
  with similar facts, a magistrate will sentence an accused to direct imprisonment whereas the other magistrate will hand the accused a
  suspended sentence.
- The task team has since engaged with the Director of Public Prosecution KZN and the Provincial Commissioner KZN and strategies are in place
  to curb the identified threat.







## **MATTERS OF CONCERN**



#### **CONCERN 1**: Court challenges

- Rotation of prosecutors and magistrates at lower courts which affects the turn around time of cases.
- Inconsistency on decisions and sentences on cases involving firearms
- None implementation of the executive decision for dedicated court (SAWOTI)

#### **CONCERN 2**: Correctional services

- The illegal access of cellphones to prisoners is a challenge and further prohibits witnesses to testify as they are threatened by prisoners.
- The slow progress of moving incarcerated dangerous hitmen from local correctional facilities to Ebongweni Kokstad Super Max Correctional Centre.
- The parolees who are wanted suspects on politically related cases cannot be located even with the assistance of Correctional Services Parole Officers.







## **RECOMMENDATIONS**



- ☐ It is recommended that:
- The previous decision for a dedicated court (Sawoti Court) is implemented without further delay.
- Dedicated prosecution team is appointed at lower courts to deal with firearm related cases.
- The Department of Correctional Service to improve on security especially unlawful access to cellphones by inmates.
- The previous decision to move dangerous prisoners from local correctional facilities to Ebongweni Kokstad Super Max Correctional Centre be fully implemented with a collective submission of State representatives (SAPS and NPA)
- The management of parolees be enhanced in order to achieve the objective of the parolee program.

### INTRODUCTION

- The purpose of the report is to brief the Inter-Ministerial Committee on the progress and status of all allocated political related cases since the establishment of the Task Team in July 2018 to date.
- The team is allocated and currently accounts for 321 dockets in line with the approved criteria inclusive of the 134 cases that were reported since 2011 to June 2018 before the commencement of the Task Team, i.e.(155 x Murder, 51 x Attempted Murder, 77 x Intimidation, 12 x Conspiracy to commit murder and 26 other cases).
  - Thus far a total of 348 suspects were arrested and charged with 62 already convicted and 155 still attending court.
  - The team has also recovered a total of 46 firearms from suspects which ballistically links to these politically related cases.
- As an effort to reduce the political cases and the proliferation of firearms within the province of KwaZulu Natal, the Task Team is also investigating parallel cases which are not related to the Task Team's mandate but linked with allocated politically related cases with similar suspect and ballistic analysis. Thus far a total of 85 parallel cases have been registered.
- Over and above the allocated and parallel cases, the Task Team continues to conduct intelligence-driven operations targeting unlicensed firearms which has resulted in 86 cases registered.
- The report will also highlight the political landscape in the Province which is contributing to political related incidents.


# STABILIZATION OF REGIONS ON POLITICALLY RELATED CASES



- Prior to the establishment of the Task Team, one of preliminary observations was that the cases were not properly investigated which led to the suspects not being arrested and most of these cases were closed undetected, withdrawn and referred for inquest.
- Since the implementation of the investigation and prosecution strategy approved by the IMC in 2018 which is centred.
   around the Integrated Multi-disciplinary Approach, as a result most of the regions have been stabilised.

#### THREAT ASSESSMENT



- Murder cases that where reported before the 2016 and 2021 Local Government Elections were mainly as a result of fighting over Councillorship positions where Candidate Councillors were eliminated.
- Majority of the Murder cases reported after the 2016 and 2021 Local Government Elections were associated with infightings within branches and municipalities over positions between newly appointed Councillors and Old Councillors, Old Branch Executive Committee members and New Branch Executive Committee members, and also Business Forums over community development projects/tenders.
- The current tension within and between political parties (Inter and Intra) is due to the unstable coalition governance as some of the political parties are using this strategy as a political battle ground which negatively affects service delivery within the municipalities.
- This type of motive was identified after the 2021 Local Government Elections when two cases of murder were reported, Cllr Zakhele Khuzwayo (ANC) as per Maphumulo CAS 62/09/2022 and Cllr Thembinkosi Lombo (ANC) as per Greytown CAS 153/02/2023 were shot and killed soon after a motion of no confidence was filed by opposition parties against IFP Mayorship.
- The politically related cases reported since January 2023 are 14 (5 Murder, 5 Attempted Murder, 2 Intimidations and 2 Corruption) and are expected to increase leading to General Elections in 2024 due to the unstable coalition governance as most municipalities are affected.
- This unstable political coalition poses a threat to the upcoming National Government Elections as it might influence the same ideology of possible coalition governance at National Level.





- Fisokuhle Nkani Ntuli (Notorious Hitman): found guilty and sentenced to a total of 189 years imprisonment for the murder of ANC Cllr Thami Nyembe and 5 others on 6 counts of murder (6 x life sentences), 2 counts of possession of unlicensed firearm (25 years imprisonment; i.e. 15 and 10 years), 2 counts of possession of ammunition (4 years imprisonment) and 1 count of attempted murder (10 years imprisonment). In terms of Section 276B of Act 51 of 1997, the accused Fisokuhle Nkani Ntuli will be considered for release on parole after serving a period of 25 years. All sentences of the accused person will run concurrently and he was declared unfit to possess a firearm.

### UPDATE ON ARRESTED OF HIT ORDERS AND HIGH PROFILE INDIVIDUALS



- The tenderpreneur and Chairperson of UMkhanyakude Business Forum Nkosibeyiphika Elijah Mkhwanazi was arrested and charged joining the other three accused for the murder of IFP member and tenderpreneur Thelumusa Mahlaba as per Kwamsane CAS 88/08/2022 and murder of IFP member and tenderpreneur Siyabonga Sizwe "Sizuzalo" Mthiyane as per Mtubatuba CAS 140/08/2022. Elijah Mkhwanazi orchestrated their killing after disagreements during business forum meetings regarding tender issues. He appeared before court and his matter was remanded to 2023-09-13 for bail application.
- The two tenderpreneurs Thokozani Tokyo Dlamini and Comfort Mqwembe Mdlalose linked to the Chairperson of King Cetshwayo District Municipality Vika Biyela were arrested and charged for the four murders as per Eshowe CAS 241/06/2022, Eshowe CAS 75/08/2022, Eshowe CAS 39/09/2022 and Eshowe CAS 55/09/2022 Murder of former IFP Ward Councillor where they were eliminating competition in both taxis and tenders. The matter has since been remanded to 2023-09-07 for indictments.
- ANC Councillor Nkosinathi Gambu was arrested and charged with other four accused for the murder of former ANC Ward
   Councillor Qashana Mchunu. The matter is set for trial from 2023-10-10 to 2023-11-23. The five accused were initially denied bail and later granted bail of R10 000-00 each at High Court.
- ANC Councillor Mkhipheni Mzimuni Ngiba has since been arrested and charged with other four accused for the murder of ANC Councillor Candidate Siyabonga Mkhize and ANC Supporter Mzukisi Nyanga during the campaigning for the 2021 Local Government Elections. The five accused have since been denied bail and the matter remanded to 2023-10-02 for bail application on new facts.
- ANC Councillor Themba Mnguni was arrested and charged with other five accused for the murder of three ANC Members and attempted murder of five other community members who were about to vote for their preferred councillor candidate for the 2021 Local Government Elections as per Inanda CAS 227/09/2021. The matter was remanded to 2023-09-18 to 2023-09-22 for trial. The six accused were granted bail of R5000-00 each.

### UPDATE ON ARRESTED HIT ORDERERS AND HIGH PROFILE INDIVIDUALS



- ANC Councillor Thulani Holi Shozi was arrested and charged with one other for the murder of ANC Youth League Secretary
  Kingdom Thamsanqa Gcabashe and two Metro police officials Lindokuhle Madonsela and Ndumiso Thusi. The matter is set for trial
  from 2023-10-02 to 2023-11-03. One accused is still in custody, Thulani Holi Shozi is on R2 500-00 bail.
- Tenderpreneur and ANC member Mbulelo Mpofana was arrested and charged with other three accused for the murder of former ANC Youth League Secretary General Sindiso Magaqa. The matter was remanded to 2023-10-09 provisional date for trial. The four accused were initially denied bail and three were later granted bail of R5 000-00 each at High Court. One accused is still in custody.
- The former ANC Ladysmith Mayor Vincent Madlala was arrested and charged for obstructing and defeating the ends of justice as well as being in unauthorised possession of his daughters firearms. Mayor Madlala was obstructing justice during the arrest of his two sons who are involved in the killing of his former body guard and his two friends. His daughter was also charged for Contravention of Firearms Control Act, their matter was remanded to 2024-03-06 & 07 for trial. Accused was granted bail of R10 000-00.
- The notorious hitman Siyanda Wiseman Thusi who is a taxi owner has since been arrested and charged with three others for the murder of IFP PR Cllr Mr Robert Sibani Mdletshe who was a complainant/victim on Sundumbili CAS 69/12/2019 attempted murder where Siyanda Wiseman Thusi and others were also charged. The matter was remanded to 2024-04-15 for pre trial conference. Two accused were granted bail of R50 000-00 and R25 000-00, the other two accused are still in custody.
- Deputy Director of Engineering at Umvoti Municipality Nomaswazi Shabalala was arrested and charged with three others for the murder of Director of Engineering at Umvoti Municipality of Oscar Hlatshwayo. The matter was remanded to 2024-01-22 to 2024-02-23 for trial. All four accused are still in custody.

### NOTEWOTHY INCIDENTS AND REPORTS



- Readily available resources like hitmen and firearms mainly sourced from the violent taxi industry, focus should be on hit orders, changing violent nature of taxi business or separating it from politics and tenders, and also review the legislation to enforce severe sentences for unlawful possessions of firearms to be equal to killing itself.
- Implementation of approved concept of dedicated court in order to half the delay in prosecution of those charged to allow timeous further investigation; e.g. dealing with the hit orders.
- Maintenance of the usage of Kokstad Maximum Prison for identified career hitmen and hit orders to prevent elimination and intimidation of witnesses organised from the so called "kwaGogo" correctional facilities.
- Enforce discipline and command and control especially at Station level to prevent the gradual increasing role of SAPS members from defeating the ends of justice role during and after political killing incident to being hitmen themselves; e.g. The two police officials attached to Umkomaas SAPS, Sgt TV Phelago and Cst MC Chetty who are linked to the four murder cases as per Gamalakhe CAS 120/08/2022 Fleet Manager at Umzumbe Municipality Mqapheli Victor Cele, Umkomaas CAS 194/08/2022 ANC Member Nhlonipho Nzimande, Umkomaas CAS 195/08/2022 Pilayelo Buthelezi and Margate CAS 175/09/2022 Murder of ANC Ward Councilor Victor Molife and were recently denied bail and their matter was remanded to 2023-09-15 for indictment.
- There is a trend/modus operandi identified from the arrested hit orders and high profile individuals to disrupt the prosecution process using the delaying tactics; i.e. when denied bail at lower courts, they will discreetly approach the high courts where bail is granted; once bail is granted, witnesses are eliminated and intimidated; during trial they will constantly change attorneys to avoid prosecution.
- The legislation gaps regarding the appeal especially by convicted criminals are of great concern as some of the criminals are using the appeal route to further commit other offences. For example, the identified hitman on Nongoma CAS 207/07/2023 was previously arrested, charged and convicted for murder and attempted murder. He then applied for the appeal and was granted bail pending availability of transcripts.

### **CONCLUSION**



- Contrary to some critics, the report presented shows that the initial mandate given to the Inter-Ministerial Committee by the President "ensuring that perpetrators of political killings are brought to book" is still on course.
- The team is closely monitoring the tense political situation experienced in KwaZulu-Natal Province especially the Northern part to swiftly deal with the political incidents reported.
- The collaboration between stakeholders i.e. Police, State Security Agency, National Prosecution Authority, Justice and Correctional Services to be enhanced and maintained in order to stabilize the political violence in the province and beyond.

SPEAKER NOTES FOR POLICE MINISTER GENERAL BHEKI CELE ON BEHALF OF THE INTER-MINISTERIAL COMMITTEE (IMC) ON POLITICAL KILLINGS IN KWAZULU-NATAL, WEDNESDAY 06 SEPTEMBER 2023

Good Morning Ladies and Gentlemen,

I address this media briefing this morning, on behalf of the Inter-Ministerial Committee on Political Killings, consisting of Ministers of State Security, Defence, Justice and Correctional Services and myself the Minister of Police who also chairs the IMC.

The IMC held its meeting on Tuesday in Durban, where it was presented with a detailed briefing on the work of the integrated multi-disciplinary Task Team

investigating Political Killings in KZN since 2018 to date.

In its five years of existence the Committee has provided the nation with several updates, the last one took place in February 2022.

The Committee remains committed to encouraging political tolerance by individuals and parties whether before, during or after the election period and beyond.

However, through the Integrated work of the Task Team; the IMC is, as committed to arrest those who use violence, to settle political scores.

This Task Team includes the SAPS, NPA supported by the State Security Agency and Correctional Services, Premier and MEC for Community Safety and Liaison of KwaZulu-Natal.

It is on this score, that the IMC wishes to categorically put on record, that the initial mandate given to the Committee, by His Excellency, President Cyril Ramaphosa in 2018, not to allow KZN to be a killing field; is still on course.

Ladies and gentlemen of the media,

As the country edges closer to the elections which are expected to take place within the first half of the next year, the IMC felt it necessary to brief on the latest developments around the investigation of political linked violence in KZN.

The Committee has been brought up to speed on the work of law enforcement agencies, who are dealing with violent attacks stemming from the pockets of political intolerance and violence, elimination of competition and in some cases just pure greed.

These incidents include targeted threats and hits on councillors, other political players such as office bearers and traditional leaders in the KwaZulu-Natal province.

#### **PROGRESS ON CASES**

Members of the Media, Since 04 July 2018, the Task Team has so far investigated 321 dockets. This is 63 more dockets compared to the last update that was provided in February last year. This figure includes 134 cases reported from 2011 to June 2018, before the commencement of the work of the Task Team. The cases under scrutiny by the team include 155 cases of murder; 51 of Attempted murder, 77 of Intimidation, 12 cases of conspiracy to commit murder with 26 other ad hoc cases. So far the work of the Task Team has resulted in the arrest of 348 suspects who have already been charged on 233 cases. 62 suspects have been convicted while 155 are going through the court processes. 17 arrested suspects have since died during the court processes.

#### **FIREARMS**

Firearms are the preferred weapons of choice for the majority of the attacks on councillors, office bearers and municipal officials. It is on this score that the team has recovered **46** firearms from suspects, which are linked through ballistics to multiple political murder cases before the Task Team.

In a continuous effort to reduce the political killings and at same time, reduce the proliferation of firearms within the province of KwaZulu-Natal and country at large. The Task Team is also investigating parallel cases, which are not related to the Task Team's mandate but are linked with politically related cases with similar suspects and ballistic analysis.

So far **85** such parallel cases have been registered. Efforts to rid the streets of illegal firearms don't end there.

Over and above these parallel cases, the team continues to conduct intelligencedriven operations, targeting unlicensed firearms, which has resulted in **86** cases being registered in this regard.



The Task Team is conducting intelligence – driven operations targeting possession of unlicensed firearms, which has resulted in 172 cases. Over 250 unlicensed firearms have been taken off the streets through police operations.

#### **REGION STABILISATION**

Members of the media, With each update to the IMC on the work of the Task Team, it is becoming increasingly clear that the team is working with purpose, agility and is focused on producing results. Prior to the establishment of the Task Team, we know that cases were not properly investigated, which often led to suspects not being arrested.

Most of these cases were closed undetected or withdrawn and some referred for inquest.

Basically, prior to the Task Team's involvement in politically related cases, the cases simply fell through the cracks.

Since the implementation of an integrated multi-disciplinary investigation approach of the task team, eight of the province's eleven regions have since stabilised.

We credit the stability in the regions, to the comprehensive work of the Task Team and the consolidated Security Cluster interventions approved by this committee.

The eThekwini Metropolitan remains an area of concern and the focus is now on this region to bring much needed stability.

The IMC is encouraged that interventions are in place to deal with all forms of politically related crimes, proactively and reactively in the eThekwini and in the Zululand District.

### Ladies and Gentlemen

Investigations of the political killings by the Task Team have revealed that the most affected political parties are the ANC, IFP and NFP.

From the **52** murder cases of councillors, **31** ANC councillors were killed while **14** were from the IFP.The NFP lost **4** of its councillors while the EFF and ACDP lost **2** and one respectively. While **52** councillors have been gunned down since 2011 to date. Alarmingly **103** officials working within municipalities as political office bearers and officials in political offices were killed.

### **MOTIVES**

Causative factors for these crimes are linked to intra-political conflicts with a few cases linked to other motives, such as Taxi violence, domestic related issues, business competition and traditional leadership competition as well as family feuds.

Murder cases that were reported before the 2016 and 2021 Local Government Elections were mainly as a result of fighting over councillors positions; where candidate councillors were eliminated.

Majority of the murder cases reported after the 2016 and 2021 Local Government Elections were associated with infightings within structures and municipalities over positions.

Violent competition between Business Forums over community development projects or tenders was also noted as possible motives.

Moreover, seemingly, there are pockets of society, where the barrel of the gun and not through negotiations decides coalitions. An investigation by the Task Team has revealed that current tensions within and between political parties (inter and intra), are due to the unstable coalition governance.

#### SENTENCING

Members of the media.

Whatever the motive, it is quite clear that the prosecutorial-led investigations have ensured water-tight cases.

This is why heavy sentences are being handed down to those who pulled the trigger AND those who have ordered the hit on the province's political players.

For politically related cases and parallel cases of murder, attempted murder, intimidation, extortion, malicious damage to property, possession of unlicensed firearms and ammunition.

A total of 100 accused were found guilty on 94 cases.

The Task Team has secured 18 life sentences:

34 accused have been sentenced between 10 to 73 years;

28 accused were handed down sentences between 1 to 9 years with 15 accused sentenced between 3 to 12 months. All the sentences combined, total to 1 517 years imprisonment.

### **HIGH PROFILE CASES**

Since our last meeting of the IMC, we are happy to announce that there is significant movement in the following cases.

Thabiso Zulu (ANC Activist) paid R5000.00 to the complainant Ms Makamu who is also an ANC member and was pregnant at the time of the incident, the matter was settled through Alternative Dispute Resolution.

**Dr Funokwakhe Xulu (IFP Member)** was found guilty and sentenced to a fine of R20 000 for Perjury, Fraud and defeating the ends justice for reporting a false case.

Mfanafuthi Zulu (notorious hitman) found guilty and sentenced to a total 10 years imprisonment for the murder of ANC Member Bongani Mhlongo.

Kingdom Phoswa (hitman) found guilty and sentenced to a total of 18 years imprisonment for the murder of ANC Ward Councillor Njabulo Dlamini.

Bongekile Ngcwaba and Thuthukani Mzolo found guilty and sentenced to 20 years imprisonment each for the murder of ANC Ward Councillor Kheyelethu Mngcwaba.

Nkosinathi Mantengu (Land Grabber): found guilty and sentenced to a total of 36 years imprisonment for the murder of IFP member Philangenkosi Nkundlane and his son Bongani on 3 counts; Count 1 Murder, sentenced to 15 years imprisonment, Count 2 Murder, sentenced to 18 years imprisonment and Count 3 assault common and kidnapping, sentenced to 3 years imprisonment.

Thanda Chamane (Hitman): found guilty and sentenced to a total of 42 years imprisonment for the murder of IFP CIIr Mfazo Nzuza on 3 counts; count 1 murder (life imprisonment), count 2 possession of unlicensed firearm (13 years imprisonment), count 3 possession of ammunition (4 years imprisonment), the sentences will run concurrently. Accused 2 Khumkani Gumede found guilty and sentenced on 2 counts, possession of unlicensed firearm and ammunition (13 years imprisonment).

**Sphamandla Ngcobo (Hitman):** found guilty and sentenced to a total of **63** years imprisonment for the murder of **ANC member Nandipha Bongekile Khema** on 6 counts (1 x life sentence) 1 count of Murder, 1 count of Attempted Murder (**10** years imprisonment), 1 count of unlawful possession of firearm (**10** years imprisonment) 1

count unlawful possession of ammunition (15 years imprisonment) and 1 count Theft (3 year imprisonment).

Thembelani Headmen Dlamini (Notorious Hitman, former police officer, turned politician IFP/NFP Official): found guilty and sentenced to a total of 65 years for the murder of Mmeli Xaba on 5 counts; 1 count murder (1 x life sentence), 1 count of attempted Murder (5 years imprisonment), 1 count of possession of unlicensed firearm (15 years imprisonment, 1 count of possession of ammunition (5 years imprisonment) and 1 count of extortion (15 years imprisonment). All sentences of the accused person will not run concurrently and he was declared unfit to possess a firearm. During 2016 Local Government Elections he contested for elections as an NFP candidate, he lost the elections and was allegedly involved in the killing of the ANC Councillor Alwin Houston, matter is currently under investigation.

Felokwakhe Ndlovu (Induna of Kwandengezi area) found guilty and sentenced to a total of 70 years imprisonment with three other accused for the murder of ANC Branch Chairperson Thulani Nxumalo on 4 counts (1 x Murder (life sentence), 1 x Conspiracy to commit murder (life sentence), 1 x count of possession of prohibited firearm (15 years imprisonment) and 1 x possession of ammunition (5 years imprisonment). All counts to run concurrently.

Thabani Ngcobo (Notorious Hitman): found guilty and sentenced to a total of 73 years imprisonment for the murder of IFP member Simosakhe Zungu and one other on 4 counts; count 1 murder (15 years imprisonment), count 2 murder (life sentence), count 3 attempted murder (8 years imprisonment) and count 4 murder (life sentence). All sentences of the accused person will run concurrently.

Nkosingiphile Gumede (Hitman): found guilty and sentenced to a total of 135 years imprisonment for the murder of ANC CIIr Sibusiso Maphumulo and 2 other on 7 counts, 3 counts of Murder (3 x life sentence), 1 count of Attempted Murder (15 years imprisonment), 1 count of unlawful possession of firearm (15 years imprisonment), 1 count of unlawful possession of ammunition (15 years imprisonment) and 1 count of Robbery (15 years imprisonment).



Mfana Ngubane (Notorious Hitman): found guilty and sentenced to a total of 136 years imprisonment for the murder of ANC CIIr Dumisani Moyo and one other on 11 counts (2 x life sentences), 2 counts of murder, 2 counts of unlawful possession of unlicensed firearm (30 years imprisonment) 2 counts of unlawful possession of ammunition (8 years imprisonment) and 1 count of Conspiracy to commit murder (10 years imprisonment), 2 counts of robbery (30 years imprisonment) and 1 count house breaking and kidnapping (8 years imprisonment). Accused appealed his sentence and it was dismissed.

Fisokuhle Nkani Ntuli (Notorious Hitman): found guilty and sentenced to a total of 189 years imprisonment for the murder of ANC CIIr Thami Nyembe and 5 others on 6 counts of murder (6 x life sentences), 2counts of possession of unlicensed firearm (25 years imprisonment; i.e. 15 and 10 years), 2 counts of possession of ammunition (4 years imprisonment) and 1 count of attempted murder (10 years imprisonment). In terms of Section 276B of Act 51 of 1997, the accused Fisokuhle Nkani Ntuli will be considered for release on parole after serving a period of 25 years. All sentences of the accused person will run concurrently and he was declared unfit to possess a firearm. Ntuli is currently be the court and is one of five accused in the Senzo Meyiwa murder trial

### HIT ORDERERS

The businessman and Chairperson of UMkhanyakude Business Forum **Nkosibeyiphika Elijah Mkhwanazi** was arrested and charged and with three others for the murder of IFP member and businessman Thelumusa Mahlaba and murder of IFP member and businessman Siyabonga Sizwe "Sizuzalo" Mthiyane.

He appeared before court and his matter was remanded to 2023-09-13 for bail application.

A second hit orderer case is that of two businessmen **Thokozani Tokyo Dlamini and Comfort Mqwembe Mdlalose** were arrested and charged for murder of former IFP
Ward Councillor **Reginald Ngema**. The matter has since been remanded to 2023-09-

07 for indictments.

ANC Councillor Nkosinathi Gambu was arrested and charged with four other accused for the murder of former ANC Ward Councillor Qashana Mchunu. The matter is set for trial from next month.

ANC Councillor **Mkhipheni Mzimuni Ngiba** has since been arrested and charged with other four accused for the murder of ANC Councillor Candidate Siyabonga Mkhize and ANC Supporter Mzukisi Nyanga.

The five accused have since been denied bail and the matter remanded to 2023-10-02 for bail application on new facts.

ANC Councillor **Themba Mnguni** was arrested and charged with other five accused for the murder of three ANC Members, **Ncamisile Shandu**, **Beatrice Nzama and Philisiwe Jili** and attempted murder of five other community.

The matter is remanded to 18th of September 2023 for trial.

ANC Councillor **Thulani Holi Shozi** was arrested and charged for the murder of ANC Youth League Secretary Kingdom **Thamsanqa Gcabashe** and two Metro police officials **Lindokuhle Madonsela and Ndumiso Thusi**.

The matter is set for trial from 2023-10-02 to 2023-11-03.

Businessman and ANC member **Mbulelo Mpofana** was arrested and charged with other three accused for the murder of former ANC Youth League Secretary General **Sindiso Magaqa**.

The matter was remanded to 2023-10-09 provisional date for trial. The former ANC Ladysmith Mayor Vincent Madlala was arrested and charged for obstructing and defeating the ends of justice as well as being in unauthorized possession of his daughters firearms. The matter was remanded to 2024-03-06 for trial.

The notorious hitman **Siyanda Wiseman Thusi** who is a taxi owner has since been arrested and charged with three others for the murder of IFP PR Cllr Mr **Robert Sibani Mdletshe**.

The matter was remanded to 2024-04-15 for pre-trial conference.

Deputy Director of Engineering at Umnambithi Municipality **Nomaswazi Shabalala** was arrested and charged with three others for the murder of Director of Engineering of Umnambithi Municipality of Oscar Hlatshwayo.

The matter was remanded to 2024-01-22 to 2024-02-23 for trial. All four accused are still in custody.

On the recent cases that were reported, the task Team has made three arrests in the midlands region in the killing of Councillor Mkhize. One accused has been arrested for the attempted murder of councillor Mangele in the Zululand region.

Two suspects have been identified for the killing of councillor Mchunu and arrests are expected soon.

### CONCLUSION

In conclusion...

On behalf of the IMC, I wish to dispel any notion that seeks to cast doubt in the work of the Task Team investigating political killings in the KZN.

Today's briefing has not only demonstrated the progress in the work that falls within the mandate of the Task Team.

It has also revealed the continuous efforts by the Task Team to ensure that firearms linked to crime scenes and taken off the streets.

The work of the Task Team has been commendable and is fully supported by this IMC.

The committee encourages enhanced and maintained collaboration between the departments of Police, State Security Agency, National Prosecution Authority and

Justice and Correctional Services, in order to stabilize the political violence in the province and beyond.

The work of the Task Team extends beyond the KZN borders, its work has also been exemplary in the investigation and ultimate breakthrough of the murder cases in the Fort Hare University in the Eastern Cape where eight people have been arrested and are before the courts.

The Task Team is also assisting in investigations in the Limpopo and Mpumalanga provinces.

Lastly, As we edge closer to the National General Elections next year, efforts are being solidified to boost the work of the IMC as well as investigations.

In enhancing the work of the Task Team, the IMC has resolved that there will be dedicated courts to speedily prosecute these matters.

The IMC again calls for political parties to strengthen internal mechanisms, to defuse inter- and or intra-tensions and instability that may escalate and lead to political attacks and killings.

assassination, whereby a young man at a business premises in Vereeniging was shot 23 times. The one accused is a police official from Johannesburg Central police station.

3. The investigation has proven that all three accused are involved in a serious organized crime syndicate, of which almost a million rand was offered for the assassination in this regard.

- 4. Investigations have also revealed that the assassination is directly linked to whistle blowing to the Hotline of Transnet, which involved millions of rands of corrupt activities.
- 5. The investigations also revealed that the firearms used during the commission of the assassination and found in their possession, are linked to multiple assassination and serious violent crime scenes.
- 6. The cell phone linkage investigations have revealed high profile organized crime and crime scene planning.
- 7. Two of the accused have in the interim been charged on an attempted assassination and other serious violent crimes.
- 8. The bail for all three accused were successfully opposed, shortly after the arrest.
- 9. Accused 1, Michael Pule Tau, the police official, has brought an application for bail on new facts, claiming that his diabetic condition has worsened whilst in custody. have obtained numerous statements from Groenpunt Correctional Services, indicative of the fact that he was causing his own medical decay with all the unhealthy food brought in twice per week by his visitors.

- 10. The magistrate, for some bizarre and unexplainable reason, decided to grant Tau bail of R10 000-00 and place him under house arrest. The reality of the situation is that there is nobody who can watch over him 24/7 to ensure that he does in fact comply with the conditions. It is actually unenforceable. The prosecution has already spoken to the DPP to appeal the decision of the magistrate and we just await the typed court recordings of the bail application to be presented to the DPP to file the appeal.
- 11. The investigations have revealed that Tau is one of the main organizers behind this organized crime syndicate. His release on bail has intensify the danger of the safety of the investigation team, especially who are the people who made statements in this case and they were the well-known faces who attended every court session. It has been identified as the investigating officer, as she has presented detailed sworn statements to oppose the first and the second bail applications.
- 12. During the first few court sessions, the investigating team was actually followed from the court building and many threats have been made inside the court room, by the family and friends and threats have been received via informers and even from a high ranking police officer in the Vaal Rand Area.
- 13. Tau clearly has a very large support system and large amounts of money are spend to obtain the best and most expensive advocates. The money is clearly coming from the syndicate as all three accused are currently unemployed.
- 14. The case is brilliantly investigated and the accused are 100% connected to all the charges against them. They obviously face long terms of imprisonment as well as a definite life sentence for the assassination.
- 15. From the abovementioned it is clear that the lives of the investigating officers are currently in grave danger, as well as the safety of the police dockets.
- 16. You are requested to urgently arrange for the safe guarding of especially the same seed. There is a real danger that their lives are in extreme danger as these organized criminals will do everything in their ability to try and destroy the evidence against them and/or to seriously derail the trial. It has just now become so much easier, with Tau having unlimited access to technology and his syndicate friends and family.

Your urgent assistance in this regard will be highly appreciated in the best interest of justice and to ensure that SAPS and prosecutors will continue to fight organized crime in this country.



# DIRECTIVES ON MATTERS RELATING TO CRIME INTELLIGENCE, PORTS OF ENTRY AND THE POLITICAL KILLINGS TASK TEAM

I trust this correspondence finds you well in this festive season. In the past few months towards the end of this year 2024, I have made observations on a number of important aspects on the SAPS and policing. For purposes of this letter I'm focusing on the three aspects that require very urgent attention to address some of the challenges at hand.

1. Filling of posts in the Intelligence Division.

All processes to fill vacant posts in the Division should be halted immediately. This applies to all posts in Provinces, including those of Provincial Heads of Intelligence that are currently vacant. It also applies to all posts currently vacant at Head Office. This should be the position until substantive discussions between the Minister and the National Commissioner take place sometime early next year.

### 2. Ports of Entry

It is common course that all South African ports of entry are managed by Border Management Authority with SAPS playing a critical role in the same space which cannot be over emphasised. In line with this role, SAPS personnel impact and efficiency should be reviewed from time to time with an objective of enhancing their role in improving security in the country's ports of entry. I, in terms of section 207(2) direct that you develop a new plan in this regard and present it to the next Ministry



Management Executive Committee meeting later in January 2025. Key reference points to include but not limited to the following;

- 2.1 A comprehensive analysis of the current challenges of security in the Ports of Entry and Exit, the SAPS perspective.
- 2.2 A comprehensive, operational and remedial action plan based on a policy of rotation of staff members among others.
- 3. Political Killings Task Team

In 2019, a directive was made to the National Commissioner of Police following the Moerane Commission report, even though not flowing directly from such that an inter- ministerial task force be established. The key mandate was to stop/investigate/resolve unresolved murders of politicians in the country especially in KwaZulu-Natal.

My observation in this regard as indicated above is that further existence of this Team is no longer required nor is it adding any value to policing in South Africa. I therefore direct that the Political Killings Task Team be disestablished immediately. Further, that a preliminary report in this regard be submitted to the Minister by the 20th of January 2025. The final and closing report must be submitted to the Ministry-Management Executive Committee meeting late January 2025, the date of which will be communicated as soon as possible.

### DEACTIVATION AND DISBANDMENT OF THE NATIONAL TASK TEAM ON POLITICAL KILLINGS

- The South African Police Service (SAPS) established the National Task Team on Political 1. Killings (NTTPK) to address the concerning rise in politically motivated murders and related crimes involving political figures. This specialised task team was dedicated to investigating. resolving, and preventing such incidents to groupe justice and maintain political stability in affected regions.
- On 31 December 2024, the Minister of Police and a directive to the National Commissioner 2. to immediately deactivate and disband the NTTPK. This decision was informed by an assessment that the task team no longer significantly contributed to policing efforts.
- The directive requires immediate compliance, with appropriate measures to be undertaken to 3. ensure the effective disbandment of the NTTPK in accordance with current prescripts in this regard. These measures must ensure that ongoing investigations are not disrupted or compromised:
- Monitoring and Oversight: A temporary transition team must be established to oversee the 3.1. disbandment process and address any arising challenges. This team must regularly report progress on the status of the disbandment to the Divisional Commissioner for Detective Services and facilitate communication between the NTTPK, the Division Detective and

Forensic Services and other business units. A final audit must be conducted to ensure all cases and resources have been appropriately managed during the transition and appended to the closing report.

- 3.2. Accountability: Effective immediately, all investigative personnel of the NTTPK responsible for case dockets are directly accountable to the Divisional Commissioner for Detective and Forensic Services until they are reassigned to alternative units. These personnel will remain responsible for all investigations and resources allocated to them until a formal handover is completed in accordance with the established protocol. The same arrangement applies to Crime Intelligence and other personnel, who will be accountable to the relevant divisional and provincial commissioners until final arrangements are communicated.
- 3.3. Case Handover Protocols: Comprehensive handover protocols for all ongoing investigations must be established and implemented in consultation with the Divisional Commissioner for Detective and Forensic Services. These protocols should include complete case files, evidence, and related documentation. Additionally, detailed records of all handed-over investigations must be maintained and appeared to the final report.
- 3.4. Assignment of Cases: All case dockets must be an additivered to a location designated by the Divisional Commissioner for Detective and Forensic Services who must establish a secure repository for case files and evidence to ensure continuity and prevent any loss or tampering. These dockets will then be reallocated to appropriate investigative units with the capacity to continue the investigations.
- 3.5. Personnel Redeployment: NTTPK members must be reassigned to other units within the SAPS in consultation with the Divisional Commissioner for Detective and Forensic Services and other relevant divisional and provincial commissioners. Detailed record of deployed personnel must be maintained and appended to the final report.
- 3.6. Equipment and Vehicle Redistribution: All equipment and vehicles allocated to the NTTPK must be redistributed to other units within the SAPS in consultation with the Divisional Commissioner for Detective and Forensic Services and other relevant divisional and provincial commissioners. Detailed record of redistributed resources must be maintained and appended to the final report.

- 3.7. Stakeholder Communication: All internal and external stakeholders must be notified in writing about the disbandment of the NTTPK, the transition plan for ongoing cases, and the future protocol.
- 3.8. Knowledge transfer: The transition team, in consultation with the Divisional Commissioner for Detective and Forensic Services and other relevant divisional and provincial commissioners, must arrange knowledge-sharing sessions between NTTPK members and the receiving units.
- 4. A comprehensive closing report must be submitted by 16 January 2025, confirming compliance with the aforementioned directives. The report should be structured according to the following guidelines:

### 4.1. Executive Summary:

- Brief overview of the Task Team's mandate, purpose, functions, and reasons for disbandment.
- Summary of key considerations that resulting the decision to disband the Task Team.

### 4.2. Background:

- Detailed history of the Task Team's establishment, objectives, and scope of work.
- Explanation of the specific types of crime investigated and operations conducted by the Task Team.

### 4.3. Operational Review:

- Summary of major investigations and operations conducted by the Task Team (Supporting statistics should be appended to the report).
- Key achievements (convictions, seizures etc) and challenges faced during investigations/operations.
- Analysis of the Task Team's effectiveness and impact on crime reduction with specific emphasis on the mandate of the Task Team.

### 4.4. Controversies and Issues:

 Detailed account of any controversies or issues that arose during the Task Team's operation.



- · How these issues were resolved or managed.
- Impact of these controversies on the Task Team's reputation and operations.

### 4.5. Stakeholder Feedback:

- Input from key stakeholders in response to the announced disbandment of the Task Team,
   for example comments by NPA and SSA.
- Summary of any public or media reactions when the disbandment was announced.

### 4.6. Resource and Financial Overview:

- Detailed breakdown of resources allocated to the Task Team relative to other investigative capabilities in the SAPS. This includes investigator-to-docket ratio as well as vehicle allocation ratios.
- Detailed financial report, including budget allocations, expenditures, and any financial irregularities.
- Cost-benefit analysis of the Task Team's operations. This should include expenditure ratio per investigator if the data is available.

### 7. Legal and Compliance Review:

- Summary of any legal challenges, compliance governance issues encountered. The includes deviation from legislation, policies etc.
- Steps taken to ensure legal and regulatory compliance.

### 4.7 Data and Security Management:

- Procedures followed for handling sensitive data and evidence.
- Measures that will be taken to secure and protect data during the closure process

### 4.8. Lessons Learned:

- · Key lessons learned from the Task Team's operations and closure.
- Recommendations for future initiatives or similar Task Teams.

### 4.9. Closure Plan:

- Detailed implementation plan for the orderly disbandment of the Task Team.
- Steps for transferring or archiving data, reallocating resources, and managing personnel transitions.

The escalation of politically related incidents in KwaZulu Natal up to 2018 led to the President of the Republic of South Africa, his Excellency President Ramaphosa establishing the Inter-Ministerial Committee (IMC) consisting of the ministries of Police State Security Agency, Defence, Justice and Correctional Services. This happened during the visit by the President to the family of the ANC activist, the late Mr Musawenkosi Qashana Mchunu who was assassinated in Plessisslaer in May 2018.

The Inter-Ministerial Committee is chaired by the Minister of Police and was tasked with ensuring that the perpetrators of politically related incidents in KwaZulu Natal are brought to book

After the assessment by the IMC of the then Provincial Task Team that was investigating these incidents, one of the preliminary observations amongst others was that the Task Team was working in silos and that it did not have an investigation and prosecutorial plan or strategy, as a result there was little or no progress in the investigation and prosecution on these cases.


A decision was then taken by the IMC to establish a National Integrated Multi-disciplinary Task Team consisting of South African Police Service and National Prosecuting Authority supported by State Security Agency and Correctional Services. The Task Team commenced its work in July 2018 and implemented the now tried and tested analysis-led and prosecution-driven investigation strategy using the organised crime investigation approach as approved by the IMC

### 3.2 THREAT ASSESSMENT OVERVIEW

Both statistical and motive analysis of politically related incidents in KwaZulu Natal show that periods prior, during and after National/Provincial Government and Local Government Elections has a strong influence in terms of decrease or increase of such incidents. It was during the 2016 Local Government period that most of the incidents were reported. The trend of these incidents started to decrease and stabilise from 2018 when the National Task Team was established. From 2021 to 2022, a sudden increase was experienced due to the coalition governance that was brought about by 2021 Local Government Elections results.

Some of the motives for these incidents include inter alia

- Infightings after Local Government Elections within branches and municipalities over positions and political power between Old Branch Executive Committee members and New Branch Executive Committee members, newly appointed Councillors and Old Councillors, and also Business Forums over community development projects/fenders
- Prior and after any Local Government Elections murder incidents reported were mainly as a result of fighting over Councillorship positions within political parties where Candidate Councillors or newly appointed Councillors were killed in order for bi-election to be conducted.
- Elimination of Ward and PR Councillors of a municipality especially in coalition governance, with the aim of decreasing the existing numbers to be able to win over the municipality (inter-political).

### 3.4 PROGRESS REPORT ON CASES

Most of the intimidation cases were found to be committed by prisoners trying to extort money from politicians and some cases were found to be false, whereby councillors will be that they were intimidated in order to get bodyguards or benefit from the security companies to provide services

### 3.4.3 Status of arrested suspects on politically related cases

### 3.4.7 Total Convictions

There are 70 accused that were found guilty on politically related cases, 13 accused on parallel cases and 27 accused on Adhoc cases.

This gives a total of 110 accused found guilty on 99 cases. 20 accused got life sentences, 46 accused were sentenced between 10 to 73 years, 28 accused sentenced between 1 to 9 years. 16 accused sentenced between 3 to 12 months. The sentences total to 1562 years imprisonment.

### 3.5 FEEDBACK ON MAJOR INVESTIGATIONS

### 3.5.1 Investigation of Nongoma Murder, Fraud and Corruption cases


From June 2023 NFP Councillors within Nongoma Municipality were targeted due to the IFP not wanting to lose control of the Municipality to NFP and other Political Parties. Two (2) Murder and Attempted Murder case dockets were registered and investigated as one incident, of which 10 accused were arrested and charged including Municipality Manager and Supply Chain Director. Investigations into these cases proved that the motive was to aliminate the NFP Councillors in order for the ruling party (IFP) to retain its

The National Commissioner of the South African Police Service directed that the National Task Team Investigating political related cases in KwaZulu Natal take over the investigation of these cases as from January 2023. To date, a total 36 accused have been arrested and charged on Murder cases (10) and Fraud and Corruption cases (26) which is a motive for the killings

### 3.6 CASES HIGHLIGHTED BY CRITICS OF THE TASK TEAM

The following cases have been referred to in letters written to the Minister of in which accusations have been levelled against the Task Team.

### 3.6.1 Mpophomeni CAS 09/12/2023 Murder of DA Umngeni Local Municipality Councillor, Mr P Ndlovu

The investigation has been finalised against three (3) of the identified suspects and as such they have been arrested and charged with the murder of the late councillor Ndlovu. The accused are remanded in custody for next court appearance on 15 January 2025 and for further investigation.

It must be pointed out that interference by AfriForum has and is still affecting the pace of the investigation and the interference is tantamount to an attempt to defeat the course of justice. The investigation against other three (3) identified suspects is ongoing

Afriforum is faisely claiming to have been appointed to hold legal brief by both the wife of the deceased (Councillor Ndlovu) and uMngeni Municipality. Such position or appointment by law, it allows AfriForum to observe proceeding at coun and not to be part of investigation.

The investigating team has declined to provide AfriForum with information or detailed progress in the investigation which is suspected to be the reason why they are making false accusations. AfriForum have been appointed by uMgeni Municipality to conduct a private investigation and they must provide feedback and information in order to justify their appointment.

The insults and derogative comments made by Gerrie Nel of AfriForum directed to Lieutenant General Khumalo and the investigating team make it difficult to engage them of respond to their correspondence

### 3.6.2 Cato Manor CAS 108/09/2021

ANC Candidate Councillor Siyabonga Mkhize and his friend Mzukisi Nyanga were brutally shot and killed and two other victims injured while campaigning for the 2021 Local Government Election

Based on evidence collected five (5) (Former Councillor Mkhipeni Ngiba (Hit orderer)
Nkosinathi Ngcobo (Hitman Coordinator), Sandile Mzizi (Hitman Coordinator). Sfiso
Mlondo (Hitman) and Phathesakhe Ngiba (Hitman) accused were arrested and charged
for both murders and attempted murder.

Bail was opposed and denied to all suspects by a Magistrate in Durban Central Court Countless attempts for bail on new facts were done at High Court, however they were also all denied

The matter has since been postponed to 20 January 2025 to 21 February 2025 for trial.

3,6.3 Pinetown CAS 578/10/2021 Fraud and Corruption case against Former SAPS

A case of defeating the ends of justice and corruption was registered after a report one received from one the witnesses of a case investigated by the Task Team, as a result five (5) suspects were arrested and charged, Induna Felolwakhe Ndlovu, former Sgt Bonginkosi Dlamini, Sibongile Ndlovu (wife of Induna Ndlovu), former Lt Col Khephu Ndlovu (brother of Induna Ndlovu) and Lindokuhle Mbonambi (son of Induna Ndlovu. Bail was opposed against all suspects, however only two suspects were granted bail. The matter is currently in the final stages of trial and has since been postponed to the 30 January 2025 for Judgement. (Detailed report including evidence is available).

The team believes that if these allegations of attempting to defeat the course of justice were not investigated, the murder of Mr Thulani Lawrence Nxumalo who was the Branch Chairperson of the African National Congress (ANC) was not going to be successfully solved.

### 3.6.4 Ibisi CAS 54/07/2017 the Murder of Sindiso Magaqa the former ANC Secretary General

The deceased. Sindiso Magaqa the former ANC Secretary General was brutally shot and killed while driving with his bodyguard, five (05) accused were arrested and charged. Jabulani Mdunge: hitman (deceased) a registered informer of Crime Intelligence, Sbusiso Ncengwa (Hitman) recently convicted and sentenced to 35 years imprisonment as per Harding CAS 17/09/2017 CIT, Sbonelo Myeza coordinator of hitmen (former police official) Durban Harbour, Mlungisi Ncalane: driver of the getaway vehicle (former police official) Durban Harbour and Mbulelo Mpofana hit coordinator (tenderpreneur)

Two accused (the late Mayor of Harry Gwala Municipality Miuleki Ndobe and Municipality Manager of Harry Gwala, Zwelibanzi Sikhosana) were arrested, charged and charges were provisionally withdrawn against them

All three accused were granted R5 000 bail, the matter was postponed to 19 February 2025 for psychiatric evaluation report of accused Miungisi Noanale. There has been delays to the trial due to accused changing attorneys and the accused claiming to be psychologically until to stand trial.

3.6.5 Margate CAS 25/12/2019 Fraud and Corruption case against Former Traffic Officer Jackson Mzindle of Ray Nkonyeni Municipality

The accused Jackson Mbekezelwa Mzindie was arrested as per Gamalakhe CAS 153/08/2019 for being in unlawful Possession of unlicensed firearm and ammunition Upon further investigation corrupt activities were uncovered on his cellphone and a corruption case was registered as per Margate CAS 25/12/2019

Jackson Mzindle for a long period gave his subordinates permission to cancel, withdraw and reduce traffic fines unlawfully and in return he will accept financial gratification and/or financial gain from the traffic offenders

In some instances, monies that were meant for Ray Nkonyeni municipality would be deposited into his personal account by his subordinates.

Both cases were enrolled, bail was opposed and denied. The matter has since been postponed to 07 to 11 April 2025 for trial.

3.6.6 Umkomaas CAS 195/08/2022 murder of Sydney Buthelezi, ANC member and friend to Councillor Molefe as per Margate CAS 175/09/202 Murder,
Umkomaas CAS 194/08/2022 Murder of Nhlonipho Nzimande ANC member and Gamalakhe CAS 120/08/2022 murder of Victor Cele fleet manager at Mzumbe municipality

On 2022-08-23 at 3:30. Sydney Buthelezi was asleep in his room where he was shot and brutally killed, a day later on 2022-08-22 at 23.45. Victor Cele was at his homestead outside his rondel where he was also attacked and brutally killed and a week later on 2022-09-11 at about 22:00, the deceased Mnqobi Victor Molefe was at Mvutshini location visiting his girlfriend when he was shot and killed. *All four cases are ballistically linked* which proves that the same firearm was used.

Two accused police officers from Umkomaas SAPS were linked positively to all three cases as hitman and they are, former Constable Collen Chetty and former Sergeant I handuxolo Phelago. Both applied for bail, it was opposed and they were denied bail by the Magistrate and the matter has been remanded to 10 April 2025 to 19 May 2025 for further trial.



### 3.11 IN CONCLUSION

The Task Team has undeniably achieved and far exceeded the purpose for which it was established. No other task team in South Africa has achieved these successes nor has been able to investigate and ensure the successful prosecution of the perpetrators of politically motivated murders.

The directive by the Minister of Police to disband the National Task Team has been noted. The initial objective and the directive by the President has been achieved with a noticeable

decrease of Political Related killings in KwaZulu Natal as a result of this National Task Team's intervention and relentless pursuit of its mandate

The South African Police Service remains responsible for the finalisation of those dockets in the possession of the Task Team as well as the finalisation of dockets which are currently before court. The following steps are being taken to wind down the Task Team without compromising pending investigations or court processes:

- (i) Stakeholder engagement to be conducted with other external role players in the Task Team, especially the NPA who have a dedicated capacity of Prosecutors working with the team.
- (ii) The 128 case dockets which are under investigation and allocated to the National Task Team, will be retained by the Task Team and investigations will be finalised. An audit will be done of those dockets still under investigation in order to establish which dockets can be returned to the station of origin or allocated to other investigating units within the SAPS.
- (iii) No new dockets will be taken by or allocated to the Task Team.
- (iv) The 115 case dockets which are currently pending at courts be retained by the National Task Team until their finalisation in order to avoid challenges during court processes which may result in charges being withdrawn against some of the accused. leading to unnecessary civil claims. These possible challenges might include unsuccessful prosecution as a result of.
  - New investigating officers not familiar with evidence in the dockets
  - Witnesses not willing to cooperate and testify due to lack of trust to new investigators
  - Further investigation still outstanding and attending to Prosecutors' queries will be negatively affected
- nersonnel who are required to finalise the dockets retained by the Task Team. The scaling

down of the team will depend on the 115 case dockets that are currently pending at courts with most of the court dates in the year 2025. It is anticipated that the team will complete the work before end of the year 2025, however the seriousness of the cases and the processes at court will indicate the cause of action.

(vi) The multi-disciplinary investigative approach (Analysis Led and Prosecutor Guided Investigation) applied by the National Task Team will be adopted and used to serve as a benchmark for the re-alignment of contract killings and organised crime investigations. Further directives will be issued in this regard.




- The handover approach will be dual in the following manner:

#### 1. PURPOSE

1.1 The Purpose of the information note is to request additional funding for investigation and closure of 121 political killing case dockets under Serious and Violent Crime Investigations: Murder and Robbery Section.

#### 2. BACKGROUND

2.1 On 31 December 2024 the Minister's office issued an instruction through the office of Deputy National Commissioner: Lieutenant General Sibiya, who was Acting as the National Commissioner at the time, that the political task team which is based in Kwa Zulu Natal: Durban be disbanded and transfer all case dockets to respective stations of origin through Provincial: Serious and Violent Crime Investigation.

#### 3. DISCUSSION

- 3.1 On 28 March 2025 at about 10:00 a meeting was held at Head Office Crime Intelligence be between the Divisional Commissioner of Crime Intelligence: Lieutenant General Khumalo and the Divisional Commissioner of Detective and Forensic services: Lieutenant General Senthumule.
- 3.2 A total of One Hundred and Eighteen (118) dockets were handed over to Divisional Commissioner of Detective and Forensic Services by Divisional Commissioner of Crime Intelligence.

- 3.3 The agreement between both Divisional Commissioners is that the docket management and administration of the dockets will be in three (2) phases namely:
- Dockets under investigation
- Dockets pending decision from court.
- 3.4 On 2025-04-23 three (3) dockets are from Eastern Cape were handed to the Divisional Commissioner; DFS, Lieutenant General Senthumule as follows:

Mtatha CAS 286/04/2022 – Murder

Mtaha CAS 341/05/2022 – Assault GBH

Alice CAS 206/12/2012 - Murder

- 3.5 The handing over of the mentioned 118 dockets occurred from the Ministers directive on the disbandment, with the understanding that the dockets will be returned back to the Provinces, to be investigated by the Provincial Serious and Violent Crime Investigations Units.
- 3.6 When the Divisional Commissioner, Detective and Forensic Services engaged the Provincial Commissioner of KwaZulu-Natal: Lieutenant General Mkhwanazi, he indicated that he cannot accept the dockets or be held responsible for them.
- 3.7 The Divisional Commissioner informed the National Commissioner on the sentiments of the Provincial Commissioner, KwaZulu Natal, who directed that the DNC Crime Detection must be informed who will dispose of the dockets at his discretion.
- 3.8 The decision was taken by the Deputy National Commissioner: Crime Detection Lieutenant General Sibiya and the Divisional Commissioner of Detective and Forensic Services: Lieutenant General Senthumule, that the Component Head: Serious and Violent Crime Investigation: Major General Motsepe will ensure

- 3.9 The Deputy National Commissioner: Crime Detection further directed that the Eastern Cape cases be transferred to Serious and Violent Crime Investigations as requested by the family of the deceased (Namhla Mtwa).
- 3.10 The dockets were distributed amongst (8) eight officers, who conducted docket analysis as attached report:

REQUEST FOR FINANCIAL APPROVAL 2025-08-01 TO 2026-03-31: NATIONAL TASK TEAM INVESTIGATING POLITICAL RELATED CASES IN KWAZULU-NATAL FOR FINANCIAL YEAR 2025/2026.

#### 1. PURPOSE

The purpose of this information note is to obtain financial approval for the extension period from 01st August 2025 until 31st March 2026.

#### 2. BACKGROUND

In December 2024 Minister of Police issued a directive to the National Commissioner regarding the disestablishment of the National Political Killings Task Team.

Various meetings have been held and a detailed progress report submitted to the Minister of Police. On 2025-03-06 a draft disbandment plan was presented to the Minister of Police which was partially approved with amendments.

It was agreed that in order to avoid adverse effect and unnecessary civil claims and to ensure continuity of cases particularly those that are under investigation and those that are in court, the disestablishment and or disbandment will take a form of a phased-out approach as follows:

- The 125 (60 Political related, 46 Traditional leadership related, 16 Parallel cases, 2 UFH cases and 1 Adhoc case), case dockets which are under investigation and 10 dockets submitted for decision are to be transferred to KwaZulu Natal and Eastern Cape Serious and Violent Crime (Murder & Robbery Unit) respectively for further investigation.
- The newly reported cases linked with the National Political Killings Task Team's Mandate shall be referred to the KwaZulu Natal Serious and Violent Crimes Unit (within Murder & Robbery Unit).



REQUEST FOR FINANCIAL APPROVAL 2025-08-01 TO 2026-03-31: NATIONAL TASK TEAM INVESTIGATING POLITICAL RELATED CASES IN KWAZULU-NATAL FOR FINANCIAL YEAR 2025/2026.

- The 299 finalised, 57 withdrawn and 9 unfounded dockets to be returned to the stations of origin for filling purposes.
- The 110 dockets (54 Political Related cases, 22 Parallel cases, 15 Adhoc cases, 14 UFH cases, and 5 Traditional Leadership related cases) that are on the court roll will remain with the investigating officers in KZN and Eastern Cape until the finalisation of the prosecution processes. This will mean the gradual withdrawal of the remaining members until all cases are finalised.

#### 3. STRENGTH OF THE TEAM

During 1<sup>st</sup> May 2025, only **56** Multi-disciplinary Team members were overseeing the **110** court going dockets and continue with the outstanding investigation in preparation for trial, as and when each case gets finalised, the dedicated detective and combat member will withdraw and return to their respective stations.

- The 20 Detectives shall be responsible for the cases currently at court.
- Due to the high-risk nature and threat levels of these investigations, the investigation
   Team (20 Detectives and 15 Prosecutors are allocated 27 Combat Members) for security and protection purposes.
- The three (3) commanders to monitor the cases in court and provide command and control.
- The two (2) Analysts (Digital forensic and Call Data) to finalise their analysis and section 212 statements for the cases at court.
- The two (2) administration personnel to be responsible for the financial admin and fleet management related administration.
- The two (2) guards are to safeguard the operational centre.

# OUTCOME OF INVESTIGATION IN TERMS OF REGULATION 8(1) OF THE SOUTH AFRICAN POLICE SERVICE DISCIPLINE REGULATIONS, 2016

- Lieutenant General TE Patekile was appointed as the investigation officer of the departmental investigation concerning alleged misconduct committed by the above employee. [Annexure "A"] Herewith a report in terms of Regulation 8(1) of the Discipline Regulations, 2016 concerning the abovementioned employee.
  - 2. The above employee was served with a Notice of alleged misconduct and pending investigation in terms of Regulation 8(1) of the South African Police Service Discipline Regulations, 2016. [Annexure "B"] This notice recorded the alleged misconduct as follows:
    - by contravening Regulation 5(3)(b)(i) of the South African Police Service Discipline Regulations, 2016, in that you allegedly committed misconduct in that during/or between January 2025, February 2025 and April 2025 at or near SAPS Head Office, Pretoria you allegedly gave instructions that the case dockets of the Political Killings Task Team in Kwazulu-Natal be withdrawn from the Task Team in Kwazulu-Natal to the Divisional Commissioner: Detective and Forensic Services which resulted in the investigation of the case dockets having been hindered and/or delayed.
    - by contravening Regulation 5(4)(h) of the South African Police Service Discipline Regulations, 2016, in that you allegedly committed misconduct by defeating the course of justice in that during/or between January 2025, February 2025 and April 2025 at or near SAPS Head Office Pretoria you allegedly gave instructions that the case dockets of the Political Killings Task Team in Kwazulu-Natal be withdrawn from

the Task Team in Kwazulu-Natal to the Divisional Commissioner: Detective and Forensic Services which resulted and/or with the Intention to hinder or delay the Investigation of these cases.

- by contravening Regulation 5(4)(x) in that you committed acts of misconduct which detrimentally affect the image of the South African Police Service or brings the SAPS into disrepute, and which involves an element of dishonesty through your association with a person or persons being investigated by the South African Police Service namely Vusimuzi Matiala and others.
- 3. Consultations / interviews were conducted with various employees / individuals to secure records and / or information as part of the investigation.
- 4. The facts as referred to here below in the sub-paragraphs (4.1 to 4.3) are common cause and form the background that gave rise to some of the allegations of the alleged misconduct by Lieutenant General Sibiya.
- 4.1 On 31 December 2024 and at 17:20, the Chief of Staff of the Minister of Police, Mr C Nkabinde, (COS) directed electronic communication (e-mail communication) to various recipients, including the National Commissioner of the South African Police Services (SAPS), General Masemola, as well as the Acting National Commissioner of SAPS at the time, Lieutenant General Mosikili. [Annexure "C"] At the time of this communication General Masemola was on vacation leave and Lieutenant General Mosikili was appointed as the Acting National Commissioner for the period 31 December 2024 until 13 January 2025.
- 4.2 Attached to the above electronic mail was a letter from the Minister of Police, Mr ES Mchunu, addressed to the National Commissioner, addressing 3 aspects. Of importance for this report is the third aspect being dealt with under the heading "Political Killings Task Team"
- 4.3 The content of the correspondence under this heading briefly refers to the reasons for the establishment of the Political Killings Task Team (Task Team) and the mandate thereof. The Minister then continues and states that the further existence of this Team (Task Team) is no longer required nor is it adding any value to policing in South Africa. In addition, the Minister directed that a preliminary report in such regard be submitted to him by the 20th of January 2025, the final closing report to be submitted to the Ministry-Management

Executive Committee meeting late in January 2025, the specific date still to be communicated at the time.

- General Masemola was on vacation leave and no directive was issued by the National Commissioner at the time. Despite the fact that Lieutenant General Mosikili was appointed in an acting capacity, the latter directed no immediate instructions in this regard having regard to the extent of the directive of the Minister. Apart from the directions / instructions provided / confirmed as referred to in paragraph 7 below, Lieutenant General Mosikili kept the matter in abeyance until the return of the National Commissioner having regard to the possible serious implications / consequences on giving immediate effect to the directive. In any event, the content of the correspondence was understood by Lieutenant General Mosikili that no disbandment is required prior to the 20th of January 2025, being the date upon which a preliminary report on the disestablishment of the Task Team needs to be submitted to the Minister which document would deal with the methodology and a strategic action plan to be followed when effect is to be given to the Minister's directive. [Annexure "D"]
- After communicated telephonic with the National Commissioner regarding the matter, Major General Sebola, the Head: Executive Support and International Relations at the office of the National Commissioner provided directions in that communication should be forwarded to the affected Deputy National Commissioners to note the Minister's directives as contained in his correspondence and they must furthermore be directed to submit reports as indicated in the communication from the Minister. It was instructed that this communication should be done without attaching the Minister's correspondence dated 31 December 2024. [Annexure "E"] The Head of Staff at the office of the National Commissioner, Brigadier GH Lethoko, subsequently forwarded an e-mail to the Deputy National Commissioner: Crime Detection, Lieutenant General Sibiya on 3 January 2025 advising that, as directed, the DNC is requested to accordingly communicate the deactivation to the relevant Team. It was further requested that the office of the DNC submit a Close-Up Report on 14 January 2025 for the National Commissioner's consideration and sign off to the Minister. [Annexure "F"]
  - 7. Upon General Masemola's return from vacation leave on 14 January 2025, the content of the Minister's correspondence dated 31 December 2024 was discussed between General Masemola and Lieutenant General Sibiya (DNC). Lieutenant General Sibiya also submitted a draft report / plan to General Masemola relating to the closure / disbandment of the Task

Team as per the directive / communication of Brigadier Lethoko dated 3 January 2025. The submittance of such report was in compliance with the request / direction of Brigadier Lethoko as per her e-mail correspondence address to the DNC dated 3 January 2025.

- Masemola was not satisfied with the content thereof. General Masemola then directed that the DNC must call for the assistance of Major General Rable and submit an amended report. On 15 January 2025 the DNC submitted a plan in the form of a letter to be signed by the National Commissioner. The content of the report was communication / correspondence addressed to the Divisional Commissioner: Crime Intelligence for the signature of the National Commissioner. The relevant correspondence attached to Annexure "E" herewith. However, the content was again not that was envisaged by the National Commissioner. As such, General Masemola verbally directed / instructed Lieutenant General Sibiya not to any further attend to the particular matter and directive of the Minister and relayed / instructed that he (General Masemola) will attend thereto himself. [Annexure "G"]
- On 22 January 2025, General Masemola hand delivered a preliminary report as per the direction of the Minister in his correspondence dated 31 December 2024 to the COS. [Annexure "H"] The report is comprehensive of nature and addresses many aspects, including recommendations / proposals on the methodology and phases to apply / to be adopted in disestablishing (out-phasing) the Task Team as well as the involvement of other role players. The approach / plan recommended in this report was totally different from the content of the draft document presented to General Masemola by Lieutenant General Sibiya as referred to herein above.
- 10. Subsequent to the abovementioned report being delivered to the COS, the proposals were not yet implemented since the National Commissioner awaited communication / direction from the Minister on the content of the proposals / preliminary report.
- 11. Despite the National Commissioner's directive and Instruction to Lieutenant General Sibiya as referred to in paragraph 8 above, and on 17 January 2025 Lieutenant General Sibiya, regardless, directed correspondence and an instruction to the Divisional Commissioner: Crime Intelligence under reference number 21/2/1/59 on the deactivation and disbandment of the Task Team. [Annexure"I"] In the correspondence it was instructed that all case dockets

must be hand-delivered to a location designated by the Divisional Commissioner. Detective and Forensic Services who must establish a secure repository for case files and evidence to ensure continuity and prevent any loss or tampering. It was further stated that these dockets will then be relocated to appropriate investigative units with the capacity to continue the investigations. See paragraph 3.4 of the correspondence as referred to. The directive for the return and handling over of the dockets at the Task Team were not in accordance and as per the decision and recommendations and proposals by the National Commissioner to the Minister as per the preliminary report hand delivered to the COS on 22 January 2025.

- 12. Since the Divisional Commissioner: Crime Intelligence, Lieutenant General Khumalo, was instructed otherwise by the National Commissioner, there was no compliance with the above directive / instruction of Lieutenant General Siblya dated 17 January 2025 or by any of the Divisions at the time. As a result thereof, and on 4 February 2025 Lieutenant General Sibiya directed further correspondence and instructions to the Divisional Commissioner: Detective and Forensic Services, once again, instructing compliance with the Minister's directive dated 31 December 2024. The DNC further directed compliance within 7 days. [Annexure "J"] Once again the approach instructed by the DNC to be followed was contrary to the approach proposed by the National Commissioner to the Minister as per the report submitted on 22 January 2025. The direction / instruction was also, once again, contrary to the instruction of the National Commissioner as referred to in paragraph 8 herein above.
- 13. On 4 March 2025, the COS communicated to various role players the scheduling of a Ministerial meeting with the National Commissioner on the Political Killings Task Team Disbandment Implementation plan which was then scheduled for 6 March 2025 in Cape Town. The National Commissioner then instructed that the meeting also be attended by the Deputy National Commissioner: Crime Detection, Lieutenant General Sibiya, and the Divisional Commissioner: Crime Intelligence, Lieutenant General Khumalo. [Annexure "K"] All the role players mentioned above (and others) attended the Ministerial meeting where a briefing to the Minister was done, Inclusive of an action plan which Included a phased-out approach. [Annexure "L"] After discussions the plan was approved in principle with certain amendments to be made / incorporated to the proposed phased-out plan.
- 14. A revised / amended document was prepared as per the discussions during the meeting on6 March 2025 in Cape Town. A followed-up meeting convened by the Minister was held on

27 March 2025. Unfortunately, the Minister was dissatisfied with the progress of the proposals by SAPS and the meeting ended without the Minister approving the proposals. In order to commence giving effect to the instructions of Lieutenant General Sibiya, the Divisional Commissioner: Detective and Forensic Services, Lieutenant General Senthumule, and the Divisional Commissioner: Crime Intelligence, Lieutenant General Khumalo, Initiated the action plan as was proposed to the Minister on 6 and 27 March 2025 respectively.

- According to the proposed plan, the case dockets under investigation (a total of 125) would be transferred to KZN and Eastern Cape to be dealt with in the respective provinces. Newly reported cases will be dealt with by the respective provinces. The finalized dockets (a total of 297) will be returned to the relevant stations to be archived. The 114 dockets that were on the court roll will remain at the (reduced) Tasked Team until they are finalized at court.

  [Annexure "L"]
- 16. On 28 March 2025 the pending case dockets dockets still under investigation (a total of 118 at the time) were handed over to the Lieutenant General Senthumule. [Annexure "M"] These dockets originated from KZN. On 23 April 2025, a further 3 dockets still under investigation that originated from the Eastern Cape were handed over to Lieutenant General Senthumule. [Annexure "N"]
- Despite the above, Lieutenant General Sibiya directed further correspondence to the Divisional Commissioner: Crime Intelligence and the Divisional Commissioner: Detective and Forensic Services dated 22 April 2025 under reference number 21/2/1/59. In this correspondence the DNC refers to his previous correspondence dated 17 January 2025 and 4 February 2025 respectively. In this correspondence the DNC instructed that all dockets, those closed, currently under investigation and in court, (own emphasis) be handed over to the Division Detective and Forensic Services. It was further instructed that a final feedback report on the finalisation of this process, including confirmation that all Task Team members have reported back to their stations of origin, (own emphasis) should be submitted on or before 25 April 2025. [Annexure "O"]
- 18. The abovementioned instruction was, once again, contrary to the National Commissioner's initial verbal instruction / directive as referred to above and furthermore, and, of importance, totally contrary to the proposal made to the Minister from the National Commissioner which

presented plan. Lieutenant General Sibiya was also part of these meetings where the phased-out plan as approved and directed by the National Commissioner was presented to the Minister of Police. He was thus aware, or, in the alternative, it can reasonably be assumed that he must have been aware, that his instructions were contrary to that of the National Commissioner.

- 19. As part of the investigation it was confirmed that the case dockets transferred to the Division: Detective and Forensic Services, are still in their possession. An inspection and status analysis were done by the personnel at the Division under the command of Major General Motsepe. Since the transfer of these dockets (dockets under investigation), the investigation could not actively move forward for the following reasons: (a) the inspection of all these dockets was a tedious process, and (b) the Division does not have the funding to continue with the investigations which are primarily to take place in KZN.
- 20. The process to be followed in closing / disbanding the Task Team presented and thereby approved by the National Commissioner was that the above dockets should be transferred back to KZN to be investigated by the Serious and Violent Crime Unit. According to the presentation [Annexure "L"], the Divisional Commissioner: Detective and Forensic Services was responsible for the execution of such task the project manager. The phased-out plan did not provide that these dockets be transferred to the Division: Detective Services to be investigated within the Division at any stage. Having regard to the content of the phased-out plan that met the approval of the National Commissioner, it is evident that the instructions issued by Lieutenant General Sibiya on how the disestablishment of the Task Team should take effect as per his instructions / correspondence dated 17 January 2025, 4 February 2025 and 22 April 2025 respectively, were totally contrary to the instructions and approval of the process by the National Commissioner to be followed in disbanding the Task Team. The process as approved by the National Commissioner was to avoid an adverse effect to the extent that the investigation of these cases is not stalled, hindered and / or delayed.
- 21. The instructions of Lieutenant General Siblya to the respective Divisional Commissioners in the process of the disbandment of the Task Team contrary to the instructions and approved plan of the National Commissioner can be regarded as gross insubordination. Although the Divisional Commissioners have, to date, not fully complied with the instructions of the DNC,

there has been partly compliance. The Instructions of the DNC on the process and manner/handling of the disbandment of the Task Team contrary to the National Commissioner's instructions and directives have also caused these case dockets not be transferred to KZN, which has now resulted in the investigation of these dockets been hindered and / or delayed.

- It further appears during the investigation that there are various allegations (although 22. unsubstantlated at this stage) that the DNC has associations with a person or persons being investigated by the South African Police Service, namely Vusimuzi Matlala and possible others. However, such investigation will be sensitive of nature and requires various Investigative processes as provided for in the Criminal Procedure Act. No 51 of 1977. (CPA) and possible intelligence driven methods. One such process is, for example, as provided for in terms of Section 205 of the CPA. However, the investigation of these allegations of dishonesty / possible criminal involvement as a result of the DNC's alleged association with :1 these individuals appears to be part of other investigations / processes and it is advised that these processes be allowed to follow its course without interfering by the course of a disciplinary investigation. Such investigation is sensitive of nature and requires a widespread approach / investigation that will take a very long period. A parallel (disciplinary) investigation might jeopardize / compromise a criminal investigation in this regard. If the allegations in this regard are substantiated at a later stage, a disciplinary investigation can be instructed at such time. The current disciplinary investigation was too restrictive (for the reasons advanced) to be able to corroborate / find substantiation for such possible misconduct. As stated, if a criminal investigation provides sufficient evidence in this regard, such allegations of misconduct can be investigated again. Substantiation of this nature might even surface in the Commission of Inquiry recently established by the President Into allegations regarding law enforcement agencies. This judicial Commission is chaired by Acting Chief Justice M Madlanga.
- 23. I investigated the matter and I am of the opinion that the evidence indicates a prima facile case of misconduct. Having regard to the above, it is concluded that there is sufficient facts / support to conclude that Lieutenant General Sibiya has made himself guilty of serious misconduct as provided for in Regulation 5(3) and / or Regulation 5(4) of the Discipline Regulations, 2016, by:
